 B. Remarks Onboard of the Ship Hercules of Nain.
 Capt. J. Goodwin. Master bound to the
 Coast of Labrador. On a making voyage. &c. &c.
 the first part of these 24 hours Commenced With Calm at 1.
 Pm a light breeze from the East &c. at 4 Pm Strong breeze
 and Showers of rain &c. and middle part squally & winds from
 the East &c. at 7 Pm Sudden but they were fair
 hatches and Strong winds from the E. S. E. &c. and soon
 as these 24 hours With Strong winds and Sett in by
 Chh 18. 40 South. Dred Long in 30. 31 West &c.

Tuesday July the 19 Day
 the first part of these 24 hours Commenced With Strong
 breeze of wind from the East and N. G. quite plenty. Kump
 "Back Whales" &c. at 9 Pm a blowing Strong & Single reefed
 top-sail &c. &c. Dred. Middle part fresh winds and D
 G. quite plenty of fishbacks. Whales on sight and Sounds these 24
 hours Dred Sett in by Chh 21. 15 South and Long in 30. 30 West

Wednesday July the 20 Day
 the first part of these 24 hours Commenced With fresh breezes
 from the East &c. &c. and middle part more moderate and
 pleasant &c. at 7 Pm the watch came and all hands
 employed in breaking out the after-hole and light winds from the E. S. E.
 &c. and latter part pleasant weather. Sett in by Chh 22. 58
 South and Long in 30. 05 West &c. &c.

Thursday July the 21 Day
 the first part of these 24 hours Commenced With all hands
 employed in Ship's Duty and winds from the N. E. & pleasant
 weather &c. and middle part fresh breezes from the north &c. at 4 Pm
 a Shift of wind out on from the west and D. G. quite plenty of rain
 and Sounds these 24 hours and Dred. Sett on sight. Standing to
 the North and N. Chh this Day Sett in by Dred reckoned
 measure the Sett of 25. 14 South and Long in 27. 46 West

Friday July the 22 Day
 the first part of these 24 hours Commenced With Strong

winds from the S. W. & thick Weather and the watch
 employed in Ship's Duty &c. at 3 Pm Single reefed top
 sail. Blowing Strong and a large Sac on &c. at 4 Pm filled
 the S. W. and middle part Close reefed top-sails and at 5 Pm
 filled the fore & Mizzen top-sail and Sharpe lightning &c. &c.
 and Sounds these 24 hours lying to winds from the S. W.
 and Sett in by Chh 26. 44 South & Long in 26. 08 West &c.

Saturday July 23rd Day 1831.
 the first part of these 24 hours Commenced With a Gale of wind
 from the S. W. and raining and with our Starboard tack
 on-board &c. at 2 Pm filled the fore-sail and blowing Strong
 from the W. S. W. &c. and middle part of these Much the same
 winds and weather and rain squalls and flying clouds &c. at 4 Pm &c.
 at 5 Pm more moderate and Set close reef top-sails and latter
 part of these 24 hours end with the watch employed in setting
 up the rigging. Dred Sett in this Day by Chh 28. 12 South
 and Long in 25. 43 West and Sounds these 24 hours

Sunday July 24 Day
 the first part of these 24 hours Commenced With light winds
 from the W. S. W. &c. and the watch employed in setting up
 rigging & pleasant &c. and middle part Strong breezes and Single reefed
 top-sail &c. at 6 Pm filled 2 Sigs &c. and latter part more moderate
 and Sett in this Day by Chh 27. 46 South and
 Longitude in 24. 23 West of Greenwich this day

Monday July 25th Day
 the first part of these 24 hours Commenced With light
 squalls from the S. W. &c. at 4 Pm winds light but a
 large Sac on &c. &c. and middle part Calm at 7 Pm
 the watch came and employed in repairing the fore-sail and Sounds
 these 24 hours with Calm and Sett in by Chh 27. 52 South
 and Long in 24. 45 West &c. &c.

Tuesday July 26 Day
 the first part of these 24 hours Commenced with Calm and
 the watch employed in repairing the fore-sail &c. and middle part
 Strong breezes of wind from the north course S. S. E. &c. at half past
