Thursday August the 18. Day
the first part of these 24 hours commences with all hands employed in cutting the whale & 2. Pm finished and got the log works underway and cleared off the Deck & C. at 6 Pm set the watch and boiling Oil & middle part fresh breezes from the N. S. W. and light S. W. winds of rain & C. at 8 Pm the watch came and all hands employed in boiling Oil and blowing strong from the S. W. and a strong sail in sight and the land in sight & C. and Sound these 24 hours boiling Oil & C.

Friday August the 19th Day
the first part of these 24 hours commences with the fresh breezes from the N. S. W. and all hands employed in boiling Oil & C. at 6 Pm spoke the Ship John of New Bedford Capt. Johnson with 1800 lbs of oil 12 months out & C. and middle part light winds from the South and finished boiling Oil and made all sail in for the land it being a boat 12. leagues and light winds & pleasant weather & C. at 7 Pm all hands came and employed in Stowing Down Oil in the fore hole & C. at 9 Pm saw a great plenty of Spinn Whales and bore away and got fast and Sound these 24 hours in whaling close in with the land & in company with the Ship John of New Bedford & calm light winds from the S. E.

Saturday August the 20th Day
the first part of these 24 hours commences with all the boats off a whaling and at 4 Pm got a Spinn whale a long side of the Ship & C. at 7 Pm all hands employed in Stowing Down Oil in the fore hole

Ship Hercules of New Bedford

at 2 Pm knocked off Stowing Down Oil & all hands to be in at daylight all hands came and employed in cutting in the whales and Sound these 24 hours close in with the of Tristan da Cunha

Sunday August the 21st Day
the first part of these 24 hours commences with all hands employed in cutting in the Whales and winds from the west & C. at 5 Pm finished cutting in at 7 Pm got the log works underway for boiling Oil & C. and middle part fresh breezes from the N. S. W. and a strong Ship & C. stood in for the land & C. at 8 Pm the watch came and all hands employed in boiling Oil and in company with the Ship John & 2 strange sail in sight and Sound these 24 hours. High cloudy weather winds from the N. S. W. & C.

Monday August the 22nd Day
these 24 hours commences with a moist nit gale of wind & all hands employed in boiling Oil and cutting up Sunk of Spinn whales & C. at 6 Pm set the watch & C. at 7 raining & cooled down the works from boiling Oil & C. & C. and at 9 Pm got the works underway a gain & moderate pleasant weather again & C. at 7 Pm the watch came & all hands employed in Ship Duty and employed in boiling Oil and the land in sight & 2 Ships at 10 Pm spoke the Ship perladour of New London Capt. Wood with 6 lbs of Oil and Sound these 24 hours & C. Gaming & C.

Tuesday August the 23rd Day
the first part of these 24 hours commences with all hands employed in boiling Oil and in company with the Ship perladour & C. at 5 Pm spoke the Ship John of New Bedford along & C. & C.
