

Remarks onboard of the Ship

and middle part light winds from the N.W. & S.W. and pleasant weather &c at 7 Am the watch came and all hands employed in coaling down the works and clearing off Decks &c in company with the Ship John of New Bedford & blowing strong from the west and sounds these 24 hours the land bearing west and General Sail on sight &c &c.

Wednesday August the 24th Day

the first part of these 24 hours commences with strong breezes from the west and all sail set & beating up for the Island &c at 6 Am set the watch and blowing strong from the West and flying clouds &c &c and middle part calm and pleasant &c at 6 Am all hands came and employed in stowing down Oil in the fore hold the royal Spirit &c &c and sounds these 24 hours close in with the land & a plenty shipping on sight and light breeze of wind from the N.

Thursday August 25th Day

the first part of these 24 hours commences with all hands employed in stowing down Spirit Oil it containing 65 hbls &c at 7 Am finished stowing down and winds west and pleasant weather & several ships on sight &c and middle part light breeze of wind from the N.W. & S.W. and pleasant and flying off & on the the Island of P. Comha &c &c at 1 Am all hands came and went on shore a whaling &c and latter part of these 24 hours the boats on shore a whaling on the East part of the Island and 10 sail in company.

Friday August 26th Day A.D. 1831

the first part of these 24 hours commences with the boats on shore a whaling &c at 4 Am boats came in and but did not get any whale &c and middle part a gale of wind from the West and fresh the fore & main topsail &c at 6 Am all hands came and blowing strong from the N.W. and set the fore & main topsail &c 2 ships on sight & the land &c at 7 Am and latter part strong winds and the watch employed in &c.

Saturday August 27th Day

the first part of these 24 hours commences with strong

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winds from the N.W. & S.W. and the Island of High Gale on sight &c thick cloudy weather &c at 2 Am fresh the fore & main topsail &c &c and middle part strong winds & rain &c at 6 Am the watch came & washed off Decks and blowing gale of wind & close in with the Island and the watch employed in ships &c sounds these 24 hours with a gale of wind

Sunday August the 28th Day &c

the first part of these 24 hours commences with the watch employed in ships &c repairing a boat and blowing strong from the N.W. & S.W. and night gale bearing N.W. & S.W. &c at 3 Am saw in a Pod Whale and made sail and got him a long side and at 6 Am got him well fast and set the watches for the night & blowing strong &c and middle part much the same winds & weather the whale a long side &c at 6 Am all hands came and employed in coaling in the whale and blowing strong from the west and the land on sight bearing North 20 miles distant & and latter part finished coaling in the whale &c &c.

Monday August the 29th Day A.D. 1831

the first part of these 24 hours commences with all hands employed in getting the tryworks underway for boiling Oil and the Island of Lianha &c the wind and the weather more moderate &c and middle part pleasant weather and winds from the West &c at 7 Am the watch came and all hands came and employed in coaling the tryworks down and 2 sail on sight and the land bearing North &c at 11 Am spoke the Ship Adam with 10 whales and sounds these 24 hours &c.

Tuesday August the 30th Day

the first part of these 24 hours commences with light winds from the S.W. and in company with the Ship Adam Capt. Agnew &c and middle part strong winds from the N.W. & S.W. and carrying all sail &c &c at 7 Am much the same winds and weather and latter part 2 and close in with the Island of High Gale and in company with the Ship Adam &c.
