

Remarks aboard of the Ship

the first Friday October the 7th Day A. D. 1831
the first part of these 24 hours commences with Calms
and in company with the Ship Maine at 2 Saw some whales
at 4 Pm Saw a Strong Sail to the South at
6 Pm took in all Sail & a light breeze of wind from the
W. by S. and hoisted the maine &c. at 5 Pm all hands
came to make Sail and wind from the S. S. E. and Souds
these 24 hours and Lat in 32.13. South & Long 17.56 East

Saturday October the 8th Day

the first part of these 24 hours commences with fresh breezes from the
South and in company with the Maine at 1 Pm forced for
whales but did not get past at 3 Pm spoke the Ship
Hydaspe Capt. Spenser with 500 blks of Oil at 4 Pm
spoke the frig. of goats of Newbedford Capt. Richards-
on with 200 blks of Oil &c. at 6 Pm took in Sail &c.
at 7 Pm all hands came to make Sail at 7 Saw whales and
forced a way 13 boats and got a whale to the west boat at half
past 9 Pm took the whale along side and Souds these 24 hours
and no Chk this Day but by Sade reckoning we are in 32.45
South and Long in 18.11. West & Souds these 24 hours

Sunday October the 9th these 24 hours

commences with pleasant weather & light winds from the S. E. and
in company with the Ship Maine & all hands employed in cutting
in the whale at 1 Pm finished and commenced boiling &c. at 6 Pm
took in Sail and calms at 6 Pm made Sail and wind from the
West and all hands employed in boiling Oil at 10 Pm finished boil-
ing & cooled down the works and Souds these 24 hours and Lat
in by Chk 32.50 South and Long in 18.31 East &c. &c.

Monday October the 10th Day

the first part of these 24 hours commences with all hands employ-
ed in clearing off decks and winds from the West and
in company with the Ship Maine &c. at 6 Pm Dashed
the reefed topsail and courses S. by in &c. at 6 Pm all hands
came to make Sail and all hands employed in Stowing Down oil
in the after hold and several bright whales in sight at 10 Pm

Hercules of New Bedford, A. D. 1831

Saw a Strong Sail and Souds these 24 hours employed in whale-
ing & Stowing Down Oil and pleasant weather and Lat
in by Chk 33.14 South and Long in 19.21 West

Tuesday October the 11th Day

the first part of these 24 hours commences with all
hands employed in whaleing & Stowing Down Oil and
in company with the Ship Maine at 4 forced for
whales the west boat went up to a whale & the boat
shearer mist the whale at 6 Pm Dashed the reef
& topsails & winds from the west & course South
at 6 Pm all hands came to make Sail & blowing Strong
from the West and a Strong Sail in sight Stowing S. E.
and several whales in sight and all employed in clean-
ing house &c. at 8 Pm forced for whales and Souds
these 24 hours and Lat in by Chk 33.35 South
and Long in 19.55 East Long &c. &c.

Wednesday October the 12th Day

the first part of these 24 hours commences with a moderate
gale of wind and fresh the fore and main topsail and
2 Sail in sight &c. at 5 Pm Saw several whales in
sight and forced a way 2 boats but did not get past
at 6 Pm spoke the Ship Hydaspe boiling Oil
at 6 Pm all hands came to make Sail & light winds
from the west and saw whales and the west boat hauled
and harpoon drawn and the Landward boats save the whale
at 10 Pm got him along side & commenced cutting in
and Souds these 24 hours and Lat in by Chk 33.12
South and Long in 19.21 East &c. &c.

Thursday October the 13th Day

the first part of these 24 hours commences with pleasant weather
and all hands employed in cutting the whale at 4 Pm
finished & got the whales to going at 6 Pm shaved up the fore
and main topsails and calms &c. at 6 Pm the water came
and all hands employed in boiling Oil at 8 Pm
