

Remarks on board of the Ship

Wednesday, October the 27th Day
The first part of these 24 hours commences with a strong gale of wind from the South and a bluish room full of Whiten and one all hands below & at 7 Pm set the watch & at 8 Pm all hands cawled and got the try works under way but blowing a gale of wind from the S. S. E. and S. S. W. these 24 hours with a gale of wind and Lat in by Chh 31.37 South & Long in 10.50 East

Thursday, October the 28th Day
These 24 hours commences with a gale of wind & all hands employed in boiling Oil and Stowing Down in the fore hold and at 5 Pm more mended & a large Sea on & a sail insight to the hieard at 6 Pm set the watch & employed in boiling & Stowing Oil in the fore hold and Sounded these 24 hours blowing strong from the South & Lat in by Chh 31.25 South & Long in 10.50 East

Friday, October the 29th Day
The first part of these 24 hours commences with a bl. hand in boiling Oil & Stowing Down at 5 Pm finished Stowing Down Oil at 6 Pm finished boiling and cooled down the winds & thick cloudy weather & strong from the S. S. E. & at 6 Pm all hands cawled & blowing strong from the S. S. E. & employed in Stowing Down Oil in the fore hold and Sounded these 24 hours & Pm Lat in by Chh 31.31 South & Long in 10.40 East

Saturday, October the 30th Day
The first part of these 24 hours commences with the weather more mended & the winds from the S. S. E. & all hands employed in Stowing Down Oil in the fore hold at 4 Pm finished at 5 Pm. Double reefed topsails & 1 and miffant fresh breezes from the S. S. E. at 5 Pm all hands cawled & made sail & blowing strong and all hands employed in the fore hold and Sounded these 24 hours and Lat in by Chh 31.53 South and Long in 10.45 East & S. E.

Heracles of New Bedford N. D. 1831

Monday, October the 30th Day
These 24 hours commences with strong winds from the S. S. E. & cloudy hazy weather & at 7 Pm the watch set and carrying all sail all night and middle part more mended and winds S. S. E. & at 7 Pm the watch cawled & all hands employed in clearing bonis & setting up Shakes and 3 Ships insight at 9 Pm spoke the bark Ship name of New Bedford Capt. Smith with the success of 7 Whales at 10 Pm saw a right whale & broad away and the water boat fastened & saved the whale and Sounded these 24 hours and Lat in by Chh 31.20 South & Long in 10.15 East do these 24 hours

Tuesday, November the 1st Day
The first part of these 24 hours commences in whale leag at 2 Pm took the whale along side & commence cutting at 5 Pm finished at 7 Pm got the Mewicks under way and carrying Double reefed topsails and middle part mended and thick cloudy & at 7 Pm cawled the watch & blowing strong from the West & 3 sail insight & and Sounded these 24 hours and Lat in by Chh 31.05 South and Long in 10.40 East & S. E.

Wednesday, November the 2nd Day
The first part of these 24 hours commences with strong winds from the west and all hands employed in boiling Oil & setting up Shakes & at 6 Pm took in sail & blowing a Gale of wind and middle part the same & at 7 Pm finished boiling Oil and blowing a gale of wind from the west and down off Decks and all hands below and Sounded these 24 hours and Lat in by Chh 31.14 South & Long in 10.20 East

Thursday, November the 3rd Day
The first part of these 24 hours commences with a gale and going to under close reef maine topsail & at 4 Pm more mended and a large Sea on & at 5 Pm all hands took in sail & Stowing Down Oil in the fore hold and winds mended from the S. W. and Sounded these 24
