ed in hauling Oil & Stowing Down in the after hole and Sound
these 24 hours & Long in 99.14 East & Lat in 30.30 South & C.

Monday November the 21th Day
the first part of these 24 hours commences with all hands Employ-
ed in hauling Oil & Stowing Down & unholing and a hundens of
whales but wild and winds S. S. East at 7 Am set the watch
and whales all round as a pleasant and middle part light winds and plas-
ant at 3 Am finished hauling & cooled Down & at 6 Am a plenty
of whales and Starboard boat hove away and got a whale and too

set the watch and got the masts under way & Stowing
Down Oil in the fore hole & Cabins & pleasant & at 6
Am the watch cameled and all hands Employed in Stowing
Down Oil & hauling and a Barque Ship in company
Sound these 24 hours with calm and Lat in by Chh
30.15 South & Long in 98.30 East & C.

Wednesday November the 23th Day
the first part of these 24 hours commences with big
winds from the N. S. W. and employed in hauling
Oil & Several whales in sight but wild and middle
part light winds at 2 Am finish hauling & at 4
at 6 Am cameled the watch & all hands Employed in Stowing
Down Oil in the fore hole and light winds from the S. S. E.
at 9 Am saw whales & hove away Starboard boat fast-
ened & line parted & Sound these 24 hours and Lat in
by Chh 30.41 South & Long in 99.30 East & C.

Thursday November the 24th Day
the first part of these 24 hours commences with pleasant we-
ather and finished Stowing Down Oil and all hands Employed
in washing at 3 Am put off for whales Starboard boat fast-
ened & took him a long Side at half past 5 Am & comman-
ce cutting at 7 Am finished and made all Sail trying to
git to the S. W. and Clever off Pecks and middle part
blowing strong from the S. S. W. & at 6 Am the watch
cameled and whales in sight at 10 put off 3 boats Starboard boat
to and west boat fastened and save the whale to the west
boat & the other sunk and Sound these 24 hours taking the
whale a long Side & Lat in by Chh this day we are in 31.00
South & Long in 99.10 East and Sound & C.
