a great number of whales and took in all hand middle
part pleasant weather & L. at 7 Am thick foggy winds
N. W. 3/4. all hands Employed in boiling Oil & Setting
up Shooks and Lat in by Chh this Day we are in
35.12 South and Long in 04.45 East & Sounded & L.

Friday December the 16th Day
the first part of these 24 hours Commenced with
light winds from the West and all hands Employed in
boiling Oil & Stowing Down in the after hole at 7 On
cleared off Hooks & set the watch & middle part finished
boiling & cooled down the winks Calms & L. and
latter part light winds from the South and Lat in by Chh
35.58 South & Long in 04.32 East & Sounded these 24 hours

Saturday December the 17th Day
the first part of these 24 hours Commenced with pleasant weather
at 2 On saw a right whale & loosed away & the watch boats
fastened & got badley blow & 2 men badley hurt at 3 On
took the whale along side & commenced cutting in at 7 finished &
Calms & L. and middle part the same, & all hands came and got
