hours Lat in by Chh 33.31 South & Long in 33.30 East &c. &c.

Monday December the 19th Day
the first part of these 24 hours commences with strong winds
from the S. S. W. and all hands Employed in hauling Oil
at 2 am pulled down the works & finished hauling &c and
middepart more moderate & airing all sail to the west &c.
at 7 am the watch could & all hands Employed in cleaning house and about
an hour sounds these 24 hours and Lat in by Chh 33.48 South and Long
in by Chronometer 33.00 East

Tuesday December the 20th Day
the first part of these 24 hours Commences with calm and all hands
Employed in cleaning house and middepart light winds from the S. W. &c.
at 7 am the watch could & all hands Employed in Stowing down
Oil in the main hatchway & sounds these 24 hours and Lat
in by Chh 34.33 South & Long in 33.25 East &c. &c.

Wednesday December the 21st Day
the first part of these 24 hours Commences with strong
winds from the S. W. and all hands Employed in Stowing down
Oil & all sail set at 5 am finished Stowing down and
blowing strong & some rain &c and middepart the same
at 7 am the watch could & all hands Employed in cleaning house and
strong winds from the S. W. and sounds these 24 hours and Lat
in by Chh 35.33 South and Long in 33.40 East &c. &c.

Thursday December the 22nd Day

Heracles of N. E. & S. E. Massachusetts
the first part of these 24 hours Commences with strong winds from
the S. W. and all hands Employed in cleaning house &c at
6 am Double reefed topsails and light showers of rain and
middepart the same and head beat down &c at 7 am the
watch could & all hands Employed in washing and strong winds from
the S. W. and sounds these 24 hours with some rain and Lat
in by Chh 36.23 South and Long in 34.15 East &c. &c.

Friday December the 23rd Day
these 24 hours Commences with strong winds from the S. W.
and a large sea and all hands employed in washing at 4 am
mashed off. Decks &c the winds more moderate and made sail &c.
and middepart the same winds & weather & a large sea and &c.
at 7 am and the watch & all hands Employed in washing ship
and Littering cabin and Lat in by Chh 35.58 South
and Long in 34.30 East &c. &c.

Saturday December the 24th Day
the first part of these 24 hours Commences with
calm & all hands Employed in getting out the flying
jibboom & spraker boom at 6 am Spoke the ship
General pick up. Ranched road with 2500 lbs of Oil
left. Some &c and middepart strong winds from the
South at 7 am winds from the S. W. & some rain &
sounds these 24 hours and Lat in by Chh 36.49 South and Long in 34.45 West &c. &c.

Sunday December the 25th Day the first part of
these 24 hours Commences with strong winds from the S. W.
and a strong sail the windward &c at 2 am saw one right whale
going to the windward at 6 am thick clouds and middepart
the same at 4 am Double reefed topsails & and Littering
left a Gale of wind and thick weather and sounds these 24 hours
and Lat in by Chh 37.03 South and Long in 34.25 West
&c. &c.

Monday December the 26th Day
the first part of these 24 hours Commences with a Gale of wind
&c at 1 am took in the sail at 5 am more moderate and made &c.
