

REMARKS ON BOARD OF THE STAFF

Saw a brig Standing to the S. E. and middle part blowing Strong from the West at 5 Am Saw 4 Ships and thousands of right whales and towed away all 3 boats and got 2 whales 1 to the Starboard boat & 1 to the Leeward boat at 8 Am took them along side and spoke the Skiffers of Sagharbour with 2000 blbls of Oil and Commence Luting in Oil whales and Sounded these 24 hours and Lat in 37. 00 South and Long in 124. 40 West & Sounded 46. 46.

Tuesday December the 27th Day

the first part of these 24 hours Commences with pleasant weather in all hands Employed in Luting in whales and 4 Ships insight and all Luting in whale at 6 Am spoke the Ship "Hannah" of Sagharbour Parker with 2000 blbls of Oil all full Oil and mid. The part light winds from the N. N. W. at 6 Am the watch cameled and all hands Employed in boiling Oil & Setting up Shooks and Lat in by Oil 36. 45 South and Long in 124. 51 West.

Wednesday December 28th Day

the first part of these 24 hours Commences with all hands Employed in boiling Oil at 5 Am spoke the Ship "George" of Warrin Capt. to her with 400 blbls of whale Oil and blowing & raining & L. and middle part more moderate at 7 Am the watch cameled and a great abundance of whales all round us at 8 Am towed away and took a long side 10 Am to the west boat and 5 Sail insight and Sounded these 24 hours with pleasant weather and Lat in 36. 50 South & Long in 124. 40 West & L.

Thursday December the 29th Day

the first part of these 24 hours Commences with all hands Employed in cutting whale at 2 Am finished at 6 Am spoke the General pike of Warrin Capt. Adams with 2000 blbls of Oil and me 400 blbls of Oil all full bound horse with 2. 500 blbls of Oil if good will middle part thick down at 3 Am Strong wind from the N. N. W. at 7 Am the watch cameled & all hands Employed in boiling Oil & Setting up Shooks and Sounded these 24 hours and Lat in by Oil 36. 01 South & Long in 124. 00 West & L.

Friday December the 30th Day the first part of these 24 hours Commences with strong winds from the N. N. W. in all hands Employed in boiling Oil and Setting up Shooks & L. and middle part more to me blowing a gale of wind from the N. N. W. at 7 Am the watch cameled & Employed in boiling Oil and Setting up Shooks & L. and no oil this Day but by Gads reckoning we are in Lat 35. 00 S and Long in 124. 00 and Sounded these 24 hours

December

Saturday January the 1st Day

these 24 hours Commences with a strong wind and rain and all hands Employed in boiling Oil at 5 Am could down the wicks & raising & L. and middle part the same & L. at 7 Am got the wicks underway and blowing a gale of wind from the S. W. and Sounded these 24 hours and Lat in by Oil 36. 41 South and Long in 124. 09 East

Sunday January the 1st Day A. D. 1832

the first part of these 24 hours Commences with strong winds from the South & comes S. W. and finished boiling and all hands Employed in the raising & lowering the trywicks at 6 Am finished and blowing strong and a large sea on & thick down at 8 L. and middle part the same & comes N. N. W. at 9 Am the watch Employed in Lapping Oil and Lat in by Oil 38. 14 South and Long in 124. 00 West

Monday January the 2nd Day 1832

the first part of these 24 hours Commences with fresh breeze from the South and the watch employed in cooping up Oil at 6 Am the watch cameled and all hands Employed in Steaming down Oil and Sounded these 24 hours and Lat in by Oil 39. 30 South & Long in 124. 00 West

Tuesday January the 3rd Day

the first part of these 24 hours Commences with pleasant weather & calm and all hands Employed in
