

Saturday July the 30. 1837

first part come up with the pinnace and spoke her capt toby 31 days out no oil burnt to the westward ground the wind N. E course S by W all sail set to the best advantage middle part steering N. E trades latter part fine So Ends
Lat. 30. 05 N Long. 29. 00 W.

Sunday July the 31. 1837

this day commences with strong breezes from the N. E steering S by W as a course with all sail set middle part squally look in the light sails latter part more moderate made all sail again watch employ in ships duty so ends
Lat 24. 23 North

Tuesday Aug the 1. 1837

these 24 hours commences with strong east by wind course S by W all sail set middle part passed a brig steering to the west latter part saw two ships steering to the Southward So Ends Lat 24. 29 North

Wednesday Aug the 2. 1837

first part fine and pleasant steered S. by W as a course with all sail set two ships in sight to the leeward latter part the wind hauled more to the eastward took in the lower studding sail and braced the yards one watch employed in ships duty So Ends
Lat 21. 5 North Long. 24. 20 West

Thursday Aug the 3. 1837

these 24 hours commences with pleasant breezes from the north steering S by W as a course two ships in sight steering to the south middle and latter part wind weather much the same So Ends Lat 20. 15 North

Friday August the 4th 1837

This day commences with fine and pleasant weather wind from the eastward St. S. H. 10 made the land bearing south 25 miles distance at noon the Island of St. Antone a beam 8 miles distance So Ends
Lat. by obs. 17. 20 N. Long by obs. 25. 16 West

Saturday August the 5th 1837

This day commences with moderate weather and baffling winds too in studding sails and braced the yards At 2 P. m. made the land a head 8 miles distance at 4 P. m. calm the captain and starboard boats crew went on shore at 5 P. m. returned middle part continues calm at daylight brava harbours bore N. N. E 15 miles distance at 6 A. m. 10 light breezes from the north stood in for the harbours at 8 A. m. calm the captain and starboard boats crew went on shore latter part continues calm So Ends
Lat 14. 48 S Long. 24. 38 West

Sunday August the 6. 1837

first part calm the captain and boats crew on shore At 8 in the evening returned with one Hog and a wild portuguese middle and latter part Calm So Ends

Monday August the 7. 1837

these 24 hours commences with light winds one Boat on shore a trading at 4 P. m. strong breezes from the N. N. E middle part lying off an on So Ends Lat 14. 50 North
