

Wednesday August the 9th 1837

These 24 hours commences with strong breezes lying off are on at 4 P.M. the boat come of load

And started of to sea and a gathering the captains still on board of the hibernia the mats on board of the bark forlure at 7 P.M. the captains went on Board of the lucian of france ships all had a fine Trading and much middle and latter Part ^{weather} Much the same Lat by Obs 13. 51. North

Thursday August the 10. 1837

These 24 hours commences with pleasant from West at 6 the wind shifted to S.E. W. and squalls of wind shifted latter part strong breezes and squally took in top gallant sails and double reef The top sails latter part the wind moderate turned Out reef. both watches employed in making sail so ends Lat by Obs 12. 15 North

Friday August the 11th 1837

These 24 hours commences with light airs and calms Middle part squally latter part calm three ships in sight so ends Lat by Obs 12. 28 North

Saturday August the 12. 1837

This 24 hours commences with light airs and calms At 5 P.M. the capt went on board of the bark forlure of plymouth old gooding master middle Part light winds from the westward latter part much the same at 10 A.M. came on squally the ships china of of new bedford carry away has get loose the Bark in sight saw a grassy so ends lat of 11. 47

Sunday August the 13. 1837

These 24 hours commences strong breezes from the Westward and heavy squalls at 1 P.M. took in the fore And mizen top gallant sails and fly gill at 5 P.M. Double reef the top sails middle part fresh gales and latter part more moderate latter part made all sail The watch employed in making spun yarn

Lat by Obs 11. 10 Long by Chor 25. 45. West

Monday August the 14. 1837

These 24 hours commences with moderate weather Saw a schooner standing to the Star middle part Fine breezes latter part much the same squalls of rain Saw a Comandante of fly fish so ends Lat by Obs 10. 03 N Long

Tuesday August the 15. 1837

This 24 hours commences with moderate weather Middle and latter part squally attended with some Rain ship china in sight So Ends

Lat by Obs 8. 50 Long 17. 53

Wednesday August the 16. 1837

This day begins with moderate breezes attended With squalls and rain middle part light winds Latter part wind hauled to the S.E. half past 10 Tacked ship to the westward at 11 tack again to the S.E. ship china in sight No obs to day long 16. 50

Thursday August the 17. 1837

This day begins with light winds and squalls of rain Middle part much the same latter part much the same The watch employed in making spun yarn so ends Lat 7. 36 Long by Chor 14. 37. West
