This 24 hours commences with fine and pleasant at 3 pm
Saw a school of black fish middle part spoke the china
Latter part moderate breezes and squally S.W. to day

Saturday August the 19. 1837

This 24 hours commences with squally and rainy weather
Wind S. W. by W headed S.E. middle part wind more
More to the south backed to the N. in at 2 PM backed again
Latter part cloudy so ends the 24 hours No obs to day

Sunday August the 20. 1837

This day begins with strong breezes breezes from the
Westward and cloudy middle squally latter part pleasant
So ends Lat 6.00 North Long 12.20 West

Monday August the 21. 1837

First part moderate wind from the S.W. headed
to the S.E. middle part backed to the westward latter
Strong breezes took in fly gib so ends No obs to day

Tuesday August the 22. 1837

This day commences with light winds backed ship
to the S.E. the watch employed in ships duty are
Differrent tasks through the day latter part squally
With rain So ends these 24 hours No obs to day

Wednesday August the 23. 1837

These 24 hours commences with squally weather headed
to the S.E. saw a number of fine barks middle and latter
part weather continues much the same watches employ
in macking spun yarn So ends

Thursday August the 24. 1837

These 24 hours commences with strong breezes from
the S.W. on differrent tasks through the night latter
part two ships in sight So ends these 24 hours

Friday August the 25. 1837

This day commences with fine and pleasant breezes
From the S.W. middle part squally latter part
Light winds and cloudy so ends the 24 hours

Saturday August the 26. 1837

These 24 hours commences with fine and pleasant wind
From the S.W. middle part backed ship to the westward
Latter part winds and weather much the same So
ends Lat 2.25 North Long 9.15 West

Sunday August the 27. 1837

This 24 hours commences with fine and pleasant
Weather headed to the westward middle part
Continues fine latter part got a lunar Obs So
ends Lat 1.16 ^{North} West Long 7.40 West

Monday August the 28. 1837

These 24 hours commences with strong southerly winds
And clear weather middle part moderate all hands
kept up to look for five balls of yarn which supposed
Shed by the crew at 8 AM commenced breaking out
The chain cable but found no yarns So ends
These 24 hours Lat by Obs 00.17 West North
Long by chron 2.20 West

Tuesday August the 29. 1837

These 24 hours commences with strong winds from
The S.E. headed S.W. with all sail set middle part
Saw a large school of porpoises latter part continues
With strong breezes so ends this day lat by obs 1.15 South
Long by chron 11.05 West

Wednesday August 30. 1837

This day commences with strong breezes from the
S.E. headed S.W. at 6 AM split the fly gib and
Sent it in strong breezes through the night latter
part one watch mending the fly gib and the other ^{rig} look
for yarns which never will be found so ends
Lat by Obs 3.00 South Long by chron 12.45 West
