

Thursday August the 31. 1837

This day commences with fresh gales from the S.E. headed S.W. with all sails set to the best advantage at 5 P.M.
Finished mending the fly gib and bent it middle part fresh
Brees and clear weather latter part send down the fore top
Gallant sails and bent a nother so ends latt. 4. 40 south
Long 14. 10 west

Friday Sept the 1. 1837

This 24 hours commences with strong and clear weather
Wind from the S.E. headed S.W. middle part more
Moderate headed S.E. latter part wind and weather
Much the same So ends these 24 hours Latt by obs 6. 10
Long by chor 15. 40 west

Saturday Sept the 2. 1837

This day commences with strong breezes from the S.E.
Headed S.W. one employed in mending sails middle
Part headed S by W. latter part headed S.W. by S.
So ends Latt. 9. 37 S. Long. 18. 16 west

Sunday Sept. the 3. 1837

These 24 hours commences with winds from the S.E.
Headed S.W. to S.S.W. one watch employed in
Making square yards middle part squally look in fly
Gib and main royal latter part strong breezes and
Squally weather So ends Latt by obs 11. 15 south
Long by obs 12. 42 west

Monday Sept the 4. 1837

This 24 hours commences with fresh gales from
The S.E. headed S.W. to S.S.W. middle part
Squally latter part fine and pleasant so ends
Latt by obs 14. 40 South Long by chor 21. 00 west

Thursday Sept the 5. 1837

This 24 hours commences with fine and pleasant weather wind
From S.E. headed S.W. with all sail set one watch employed in
Making square yards middle part the wind more to the
Eastward headed south as a course latter part weather continues much
The same So ends Latt by chor Obs. 16. 10. South
Long by chor 21. 20. west

Wednesday Sept the 6. 1837

These 24 hours commences with moderate weather wind from
The eastward steering south as a course one watch employed
In making square yards middle part continues much the
The same latter part raised a large sperm whale at 9
A.M. lowered and struck and killed him at 12
Took him a long side and commenced cutting So ends
These 24 hours Latt by obs 16. 48 south
Long by Chor. 21. 39 west



Thursday Sept the 7. 1837

These 24 hours commences with strong and squally
Weather wind from the eastward at 7 P.M. commenced
Cutting at 7 P.M. lashed down and took in all sail
Tulls through the night at day light called all hands
And finished cutting latter part continues, rugged
And squally so ends Latt by obs 15. 40 South
Long by chor 21. 30. west

Friday Sept the 8. 1837

These 24 hours commences with strong gales from the
Eastward all hands employed in cutting at 5 P.M. finished
Cutting wore ship and made sail and headed south at
8 P.M. commenced boiling middle part squally took in
Fore and main top gallant sails at day light wore
Moderate set them a gain latter continues with light
Squally so ends Latt by obs 17. 35 South
Long by chor 20. 50 west

Saturday Sept the 9. 1837

This day commences with fine and pleasant breezes
From the S.E. headed S.W. with all sail set finished
Boiling 20 barrels of sperm oil latter part fine and
Pleasant so ends Latt by obs 20. 00 south
Long by chor 20. 10 west
