

Wednesday Sept the 20. 1837

These 24 hours commences with pleasant gales and fair
Wether wind from the S.E. & headed S.E. by S
Watches employed in different jobs about the ship
Middle part mended the fore royal and set it day
Light saw five backs and plenty of birds latter part
Moderate and cloudy So Ends Lett by obs 33.10 South
Long by Chron. 4.13 West

Thursday Sept the 21 1837

These 24 hours light winds from the north-west
And moderate wether headed S.E. with all sail
Set to the best advantage watches employed in
Different jobs about the ship middle
Part the wind hauled to the S.E. shifted studding
Sail over on the other side So Ends these 24 h
Lett by obs 34.7 South Long by Chron. 2.40 West

Friday Sept the 22. 1837

These 24 hours commences strong breezes from
The S.W. & headed S.E. by E with all sail set
Middle part the wind hauled to S.E. and increas^{ed}
A gale at day light single reef the topsails
Latter part split the fore topsail closed it
Up and mended it and set it double reef so ends
Lett by obs 35.27 South Long by Chron. 0.55 East
By Lunar. 00 2.8 West

Saturday Sept the 23. 1837

These 24 hours commences with strong gales from
The S.E. headed S.E. and single reef topsails
Watches employed in making secure middle
Part more moderate lett the reefs out of the
Topsails and set topgallant sails at 2 P.M. the wind
Shifted S.W. & set studding sails on and a left latter
Part the shifted to the S.W. and squally
Took in studding sails and braced the yards
So Ends Lett by obs 36.25 South Long by Chron
.2.45 East

Sunday Sept the 24 1837

These 24 hours commences with strong gales from the
S.E. headed E. S.E. a large quantity of birds flying round
The ship a good break for whales watches employed
In picking up spinn yarn middle part moderate
And water green some few birds sailing a boat
The ship latter part saw spouts and breaches were for
Them and found there to be hump backs this day ends
With cold and cloudy wether wind from the S.E. & S.W.
Lett by obs 36.38 South Long by Chron. 4.22 West

Monday Sept the 25. 1837

These 24 hours commences with moderate breezes
And cloudy wether wind from the S.W. headed
E.S.E. with all sail set watches employed in mending
Old close M & P.M. the wind hauled out S.W. headed
Ship middle part headed S.W. latter part wind
And wether much the same so ends these 24 hours
Lett by obs. 36.05 South Long by Chron. 5.03 East

Tuesday Sept the 26. 1837

These 24 hours commences with cloudy wether wind
S.E. headed S.W. with all sail set saw hump backs
and five backs whales and large quantity of birds watches
employed in fitting a spare boat for whaleing middle
part headed S.E. at 12 midnight equally took in fly get
more topgallant sail at day light set them a gair
latter part wether quite moderate several hump backs in
sight So Ends Lett by obs. 35.10 South
Long by Chron. 07.12 East
