

Saturday Oct The 21. 1837

This day commences with a gale of wind all hands employed in getting in a stowen boat plenty of whales in sight. Whales in sight at 3 p.m. began to moderate at 4 p.m. found the whale that we killed yesterday middle part pleasant at day light called all hands and commenced cutting saw 6 whales to the windward but did not lower at 5 A.M. finished cutting So Ends

Sunday Oct the 22. 1837

These 24 hours commences with fine and pleasant weather all hands employed in boiling at 4 P.M. raised whales lowered and struck too the warst boat got up set and no body hurt saved one whale and the other went of scurrying blood at 6 p.m. took him along side and took in all sail at day light called all hand and commenced cutting at 8 A.M. finished and began to boiling latter part the weather continues the same so ends

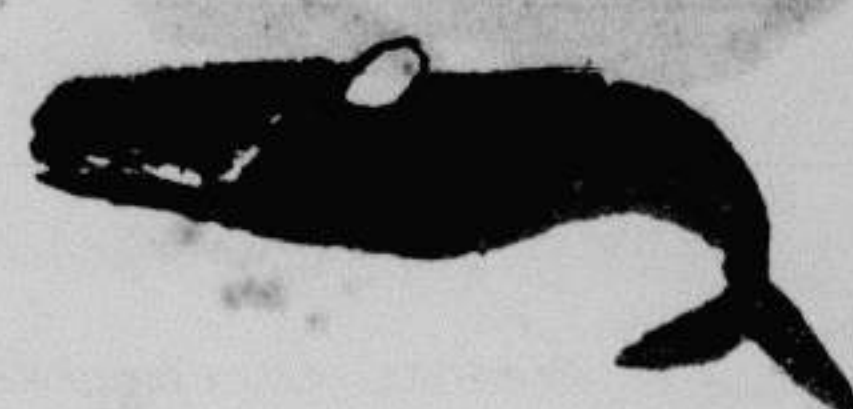
Monday Oct the 23. 1837

These 24 hours commences with fine and pleasant weather all hands employed in boiling at 3 P.M. spoke the ships London packet capt. Jerny 16 m.m. out 1700 barrels of whale oil 300 of sperm at 4 p.m. raised whales going quick to the windward did not lower middle continues the same latter part the bark Franklin got a whale under our lee So Ends

Tuesday Oct the 24. 1837

These 24 hours commences with fine and pleasant weather all hand employed in boiling at 1 P.M. raised sperm whales lowered and struck to the London boat at 3 P.M. took him along side and commenced cutting middle part the weather fine and pleasant at 6 A.M. called all hands and commenced cutting latter part fresh gales and ruffed all hands employed in cutting at 11 A.M. parted from the head and lost it So Ends So obs to day

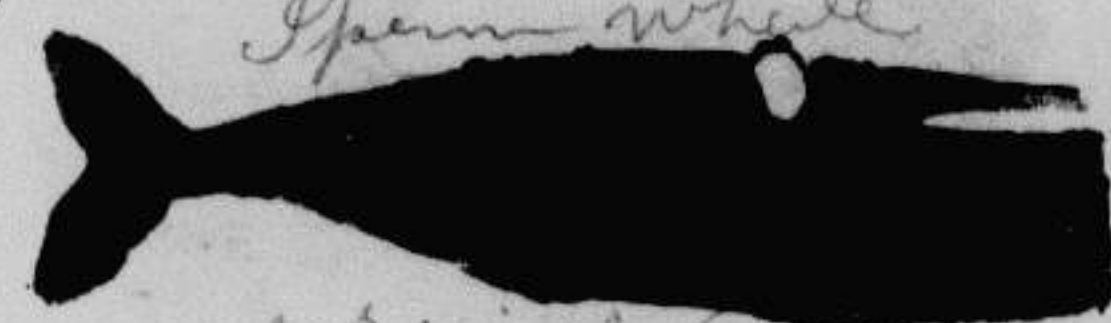


Wednesday Oct the 25. 1837

This day commences with fine weather all hands employed in boiling at 4 P.M. showed whales got more middle part fresh gales latter part spoke the London packet 2100 hundred So Ends Salt by obs 35.10 S.

Thursday Oct the 26. 1837

This day begins with cloudy weather one watch employed in boiling the other in storing down at day light two ships in sight latter part the weather fine and pleasant So Ends

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Friday Oct the 27. 1837

These 24 hours commences with heavy gales from the S.E. all hands employed in boiling at 3 P.M. finished boiling the body of 12 barrels of sperm oil middle part the weather squally and ruffed latter part the London packet got one whale under our lee plenty of whales in sight So Ends
