

Saturday Oct. the 28. 1837

This day commences with strong gales from the S.W. all hands employed in stowing in down at 1 P.M. lowered for whales struck one to the harbor boat took the line and two cores and word of saw a great many whales the rest part of the day but too rugged to lower middle part more moderate wore ship to the northward latter part saw a ship to the windward moving So Ends

Sunday Oct the 29. 1837.

These 24 hours commences with strong gales from the S.W. quired the yards and steered S.E. by E. under moderate sail at 4 P.M. took in all sail at day light set double reef topsails latter part saw five backs so ends Sat by obs 35. 45. S. Song by Chor. 59. 20 East



Monday Oct the 30. 1837

These 24 hours commences with strong gales from the S.W. steering S.E. by E. at 4 P.M. hove to and took in all sail middle part squally and rainy at 5 P.M. saw a ship standing to the S.W. at 11. saw whales lowered and chased with out any success came on board and steered N.W. by E. So Ends

Tuesday Oct. 31. 1837

These 24 hours fresh gales and a heavy sea a ship in sight to the leeward at 4 P.M. saw plenty of whales but too rugged to lower took in all sail middle part squally latter part wether much the same set the mizzen top sails close reef So Ends

Song by Chor. 61. 50 East

Wednesday Nov. the 1. 1837

All these 24 hours heavy gales from the westward middle part begin to moderate at day light made sail and stood to the northward saw a ship to the windward latter part raised whales lowered and killed one to the waist boat So Ends

Sat by obs 35. 10. South
Song by Chor. 61. 47 East

Thursday Nov the 2. 1837

These 24 hours commences with moderate wether heavy swell at 2 P.M. took a whale a long side and commenced cutting at 6 P.M. finished cutting and took all sail in middle blows a heavy gale from the S.W. latter thick and rainy wether employed in the blubber room so ends.

Friday Nov the 3 1837

This day commences with squally and rugged wether wind from the N.W. at 1 P.M. wore ship and headed to the S.W. at 6 P.M. foggy and moderate saw plenty of whales watches employed in working in the blubber room at 1 P.M. wore ship to the northward at day light made sail and commenced cutting latter part saw whales lowered and chased come on board foggy and give up the chase So Ends

Sat. 35. 20 Song. 61. 58 E

Saturday Nov the 4 1837

These 24 hours commences with strong breezes and foggy wether all hands employed in boiling middle part the wether moderate and clear wore ship and headed to the northward under moderate sail latter part light breezes and clear saw 1 whale and chased them with out any success so ends Sat by obs 35. 20 South
