

Sunday Nov. the 5. 1837

First part fine and pleasant headed S. W. with all sail set at 1 P.M. finished boiling saw whales lowered and struck one to the larboard boat at 3 P.M. took him along side and commenced cutting at 5 P.M. finished and made sail headed W. by N. middle part strong gales at day light double reef the topsails latter part all hands employed in stowing down So Ends

Monday Nov. the 6. 1837

First part fresh gales from the S. W. all hands employed in stowing down middle part squally latter part moderate headed N. W. by S. 20 ends

Tuesday Nov. the 7. 1837

These 24 hours moderate weather and mainly wind from the Eastward headed N. W. by N. middle part rainy latter part saw whales lowered and struck one to the larboard boat So Ends

Wednesday Nov. the 8. 1837

These 24 hours commences with rainy weather all hands employed in cutting in a whale at 5 P.M. took in all sail and set the water boats crew middle part saw whales lowered and struck one to the larboard boat at 11 P.M. took him a long side and commenced cutting So Ends

Long. 61. 10 East



Thursday Nov. the 9. 1837

These 24 hours commences with fine weather killed a whale to the waist boat and sunk him latter part killed one to the larboard boat and saved him So Ends Latt. 35. 00. South
Long. 61. 20 East



Friday Nov. the 10. 1837

These 24 hours commences with strong breezes all hands employed boiling middle part fine and moderate with weather at 8 P.M. chased whales with out any success latter part saw a ship to the windward boiling So Ends Latt. 34 58. South Long. 61. 18 East

Saturday Nov. the 11. 1837

This day fine and pleasant weather all hands employed in boiling and stowing down at 5 P.M. chased whales with out any success strong breezes through the night latter part more moderate spoke the Herald of New Bedford Manchester master 1600 barrels So Ends Latt. 34 50. South Long. 61. 40 East

Sunday Nov. the 12. 1837

This day commences with fine and pleasant weather at 3 P.M. saw whales lowered and chased with out any success saw a ship a head maneuvering finely whales middle continues moderate saw a ship boiling latter part quiet squally and rugged So Ends Latt by obs. 34. 51. S

Monday Nov. the 13. 1837

First part commences with squally weather saw several ships daddling on different tacks saw whales to rugged to lower at 5 P.M. took the fore and main topsails middle part rainy at day light set the topsails double reef saw whales lowered and chased with out any success So Ends Latt by obs. 35. South Long by Chron. 61. 20 East
