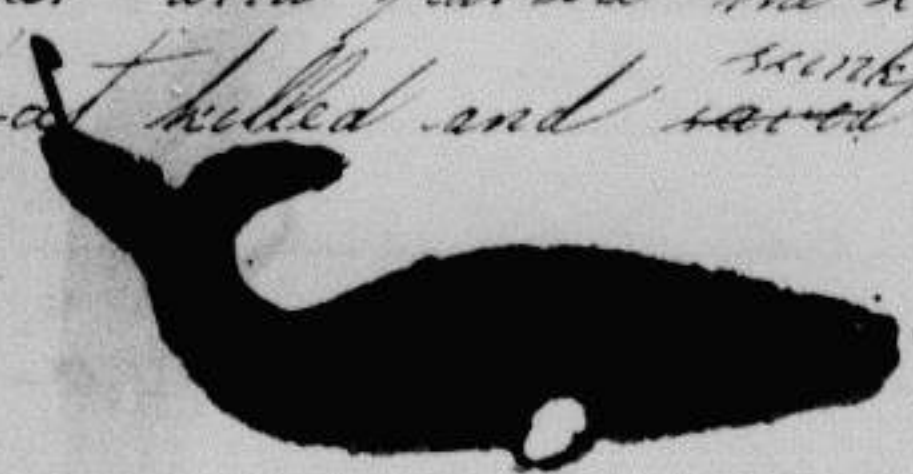


Tuesday Nov the 14. 1837

These 24 hours commences with fine and pleasant weather spoke the salma of new Bedford. 7 m. north out. 600. barab. latter part saw whales lowered and struck one to the larboard boat and parted the line struck another to the starboard boat killed and ^{sunk} ~~saw~~ him lost 2 lines 5 iron. So Ends

Wednesday Nov the 15. 1837

First part calm three ships in sight at 2. P.M. saw whales lowered and struck two the waist and starboard boat the waist boat drewed and lost their whale saved one to the starboard boat at 6. P.M. took him along side and cut him in the same night middle and latter part a gale of wind So Ends

Thursday Nov the 16. 1837

These 24 hours commences with strong breezes from the S. E. middle part more moderate at 6. A.M. spoke the masure of new London 1800 hundred barrels twenty m. out latter part several ships in sight no whales all hands employed boiling So Ends Latt. 34. 58 south

Long 60. 24 East

Friday Nov the 17. 1837

These 24 hours commences with fine and pleasant weather spoke salma all hands employed in boiling middle part rainy and moderate all day finished boiling so barab of oil latter part squally So Ends

Latt by obs 35. 10 South
Long by Chor. 59. 50 East

Saturday Nov the 18. 1837

These 24 hours commences with squally weather middle part the wind from the S.W. the weather thick and moderate latter part continues thick So Ends
no Latitude to day

Sunday Nov the 19. 1837

These 24 hours thick and rainy weather in all sail and let her head to the westward middle part more clear latter a great many whales in sight lowered and struck one to the starboard boat the spade cut the line of and lost the whale and chased all the rest of the of day but got none So Ends

Monday Nov the 20. 1837.

These 24 hours commences with fine and pleasant weather all hands employed in chasing whales middle part commenced a gale of wind with thick and rainy weather latter commenced stowing down saw a sail pass to the northward So Ends
no latitude to day

Tuesday Nov the 21. 1837

This day commences with heavy gales from S.E. and rainy weather all hand employed in stowing down middle and latter part weather much the same So Ends
Latt by obs 35. 15 South Long by Chor. 59. 60. 00

Wednesday Nov the 22. 1837

These 24 hours commences with strong breezes and squally all hand employed in chasing whales at 5 P.M. struck and killed one to the larboard boat middle part gales from the S. E. latter part more moderate all hands employed in cutting in So Ends. Latt by obs 35. 30 South
Long by Chor 60. 12. East
