Friday Nov. the 24. 1837

This day begins with moderate weather all hands employed in boiling at 2 P.M. saw whales lowered and struck and killed one to the larboard boat at 5 P.M. took him a long side and took in all sail and let him lay at one night latter part cut him in saw whales and got another to the larboard boat So Ends

Saturday Nov. the 25. 1837

These 24 hours commences with moderate weather all hands employed in cutting in middle part commenced boiling latter part strong breezes So Ends

Sunday Nov. the 26. 1837

These 24 hours commences with a heavy gale from the westward at 7 P.M. cob down the works to rugged to boil and took in the fore sail at day light set the fore sail and commenced boiling a gain latter part quite moderate So Ends

Latt. 35. 5 South Long 61. 16 East

Monday Nov. the 27. 1837

These 24 hours commences with light winds and a heavy swell at 2 P.M. wore ship and headed to the south middle part moderate latter part finished boiling So Ends

Latt 35. 45 South
Long 61. 05 East

Tuesday Nov. the 28. 1837

These 24 hours strong breezes all hands employed in stowing down middle part quickly latter part fine and moderate So Ends

Wednesday Nov. the 29. 1837

first part fine and moderate all hands employed in cleaning ship middle part calm latter part light breezes from the northward saw whales lowered and struck one to the larboard boat at 11 P.M. took him a long side So Ends

Thursday Nov. the 30. 1837

These 24 hours commences with fine and pleasant breezes saw whales lowered and chased with out any success at 4 P.M. took in all sail for the night middle part rugged latter part wether much the same all hands employed in clearing bone two men sick

Friday Dec. the 1. 1837

These 24 begins with breezes from the westward the wether thick and rainy at 2 P.M. sheered S.E. by E. as a course under short sail at 4 P.M. raised whales lowered and killed two whales and saved one and saved the other middle part the wether fine and pleasant latter calm cutting So Ends
