

Tuesday Dec the 11. 1837

These 24 hours commences with strong gales from the northward middle part rainy latter part saw a ship standing to the northward and eastward So Ends

Lat by obs 37.25 South
Long by theor 59.53 East

Wednesday Dec the 12. 1837

These 24 hours commences with strong gales and rugged weather all hands employed in different So's about the ship latter part rainy So Ends Lat 37.20 South

Long 59.20 East

Thursday Dec the 13. 1837

These 24 commences with heavy gales from the northward all hands employed in shipping middle part more moderate latter part made sail and raised whales lowered and got one to the waist boat So Ends

Lat 36.58 South
Long 59.45 East



Friday Dec the 14. 1837

These 24 hours commences with pleasant breezes from the westward all hands employed in cutting in a whale at 1 P.M. finished cutting made sail and commenced boiling at 4 P.M. took in all sail at day light made sail and steered S.E. latter part calm So Ends

Lat by obs 36.36 South
Long by theor 60.23 East

Saturday Dec the 15. 1837

These 24 hours begins with light breezes and pleasant weather wind from the westward middle part calm latter part all hands employed in stowing down So Ends

Lat by obs 36.27 South
Long by theor 61.00 East

Sunday Dec the 16. 1837

All these 24 hours begins with light breezes steered S.E. as a course wind from the westward all hands employed in stowing down at 2 P.M. raised whales and looked for them and chased but got none at 4 P.M. spoke the Juniper of France 5 months out 8 whales took in all sail and went a gaming at day light made sail saw whales lowered and got one to the waist boat latter part all hands employed in cutting in a whale So Ends Lat by obs 37.20 South

Long by theor 62.10 East



Monday Dec the 17. 1837

These 24 hours commences with fine and pleasant weather saw whales lowered and got one to the larboard boat middle part continues fine one ship in sight latter part wind and weather much the same So Ends

Lat 36.37 South
Long 62.17 East



Tuesday Dec the 18. 1837

These 24 hours commences with fine and pleasant weather all hands employed in boiling at 4 raised whales lowered struck to the larboard boat one man got hurt and lost the whale middle and latter part weather much the same one ship in sight So Ends

Lat 36.47 South
Long 62.50 East

Wednesday Dec the 19. 1837

The first part of these 24 hours fine and pleasant breezes from the westward all hands employed in boiling middle part finished boiling latter part stowing down saw whales and chased them with out any success So Ends Lat by obs 37.03 South

Long by theor 63.41 East
