These 24 hours commences with strong breezes and a heavy swell at 3 P.M. set the topsails double reef headed N. S. W. by the wind plenty of birds flying a bout middle part blow on latter part took in fore and mizen topsails So Ends Satt. 40.30 South Long 75.45 East

Sunday Dec^r the 31. 1837

These 24 hours commences with strong westerly winds at 1 P.M. set the topsails headed S. S. W. at 4 P.M. let the reefs out the topsails and steered west middle part come on to blow took in fore and mizen topsails close reef the main at day light took in the fore sail So Ends

Monday Jan^r the 1. 1838

First part of these 24 hours set the fore top sail and the foresail were ships and steered north two points variation to the eastward middle part moderate set all sail latter part continues fine So Ends

Tuesday Jan^r the 2 1838

These 24 hours begins with strong breezes and pleasant weather fair wind from the S. W. course north watches employed in ships duty middle and latter part rugged So Ends Satt by obs. 37.42 South Long by theor. 74.50 East

Wednesday Jan^r the 3 1838

These 24 hours commences with strong breezes and rugged ship heads. S. S. by 80 middle part headed S. S. by 8. latter part headed S. by 80 with all sail set watches employed in ships duty So Ends Satt by obs. 34.45 South Long by theor. 74.40 East

Thursday Jan^r the 4 1838

These 24 hours commences with thick and moderate weather middle part rainy latter part the weather fine and pleasant steered north with all sail set to the best advantage So Ends Satt by obs. 31.02 South Long 74.50 East

Friday Jan^r the 5. 1837

These 24 hours commences with fine and pleasant weather wind from the westward steered N. S. as a course with all sail set to the best advantage middle part the wind hauled round to the south squired the yards and steered S. S. W. 88. latter part all hands employed in washing ships So Ends

Satt 30.06 South Long 74.40 East

Saturday Jan^r the 6. 1838

These 24 hours begins with fine and pleasant breezes from the westward all hands employed in washing ships at 4 P.M. saw sperm whales lowered and chased with out any success at 7 P.M. shorten sail at day light made all sail and steered S. S. W. at 10:18 A.M. steered S. W. 88. with all sail So Ends

Satt 29.20 South Long 76.00 East

Sunday Jan^r the 7. 1838

These 24 hours commences with fine and pleasant weather wind from the S. S. watches employed in bending raw sails light breezes through the night latter part set fore top sail studding sail So Ends Satt 28.28 South Long 75.20 East

Monday Jan^r the 8 1837

These 24 hours commences with fine pleasant breezes from S. S. course S. S. W. by 80 middle part rainy latter part watches employed in mending sails So Ends Satt 27.15 South Long 72.45 East
