

Tuesday Jan. the 9. 1838

These 24 hours commences with fine breezes from the S.E. middle part squally and some rain latter part the wind S.E. course N. 54° So Ends Lat. 27.00 South Long. 70.40 East

Wednesday Jan. the 10. 1838

These 24 hours commences with strong breezes and pleasant weather water has employed in mending sails wind S.E. course S. 56° middle and latter part with fine and pleasant S. Ends Lat. 26.50 South Long. 69.00 East

Thursday Jan. the 11. 1838

These 24 hours commences with fine and pleasant breezes from the S.E. steered S. 55° as a course water has employed in different jobs about the ship middle and latter part strong breezes So Ends Lat. 25.30 South Long. 67.20 East

Friday Jan. the 12. 1838

These 24 hours commences with strong trades from the S.E. middle part light squalls of rain latter part fine and pleasant weather So Ends Lat. 23.10 South Long. 66.00 East

Saturday Jan. the 13. 1838

These 24 hours commences with light breezes and pleasant trades from the S.E. course S. 54° by N. middle part the wind from the southward latter part calm So Ends Lat. 22.39 South Long. 65.40 East

Sunday Jan. the 14. 1838

These 24 hours commences with light breezes from the S.E. steered S. 55° as a course with all sail set latter part saw a sail So Ends these 24 hours

Monday Jan. the 15. 1838

These 24 hours begins with moderate weather and pleasant trades from the S.E. middle part light winds latter part saw a sail to the windward of us So Ends Lat. 19.44 South Long. 64.18 East

Tuesday Jan. the 16. 1838

This day commences with fine and pleasant trades from the S.E. at 4 P.M. made the land at 7 P.M. took in sail and lay to at day light made sail and stood in to the harbour and came to anchor So Ends Lat. Long

Wednesday Jan. the 17. 1838

This day commences with fine and pleasant weather left on shore middle and latter part fresh breezes of the land So Ends these 24 hours

Thursday Jan. the 18. 1838

This day begins with strong breezes all hands employed in getting water to the ship So Ends these 24 hours

Friday Jan. the 19. 1838

This day begins with strong breezes at 4 P.M. took our anchor and steered "S. 55°" middle and latter part the weather continues much the same So Ends 580 lbs to day

Saturday Jan. the 20. 1838

These 24 hours fresh gales and pleasant weather middle part shorten sail latter part made the isle of France So Ends 580 lbs to day
