These 24 hours begins with fine and pleasant trades from the S.E. headed N. by E. middle and latter part continues the same So Ends this day

Thursday Feb. the 1. 1838

These 24 hours commences with light winds and pleasant weather middle part wore ships and steered N. by W. as a course latter part took in the waist boat to repair

So Ends this day

Lat. 22.09 South

Long. 53.00 East

Friday Feb. the 2. 1838

This day commences with fine and pleasant S.E. trades middle part lay to under short sail latter part steered N. as a course with all sail set to the best advantage So Ends

Lat. 21.50 South

Long. 52.25 East

Saturday Feb. the 3. 1838

These 24 hours commences with fine and pleasant breezes from the eastward middle part under short sail latter saw sperm whales lowered and chased sperm whales

with out any success So Ends

Lat. 22.15 South

Long. 54.00 East

Sunday Feb. the 4. 1838

First part fine and pleasant weather wind from the eastward middle part squally taken in all sail to double reef main topsail at 11 A.M. saw whales lowered and chased with out any success latter part calm So Ends

Lat. 22.55. South

Long. 50.05. East

Monday Feb. the 5. 1838

This day commences with calm and pleasant weather chased whales and got none middle part lay to with all sail in latter part raised them again lowered and chased all day without any success So Ends

Lat. 22.21 South

Long. 49.50 East

Tuesday Feb. the 6. 1838

These 24 hours begins with pleasant weather plenty of sperm whales in sight chased till 4 P.M. with out any success middle part steered N. by E. under short sail latter part squally and rainy So Ends
