

Wednesday Feb the 13. 1838

These 24 hours begins with strong breezes from the eastward course W by S. middle part the wind quite light latter part rainy So Ends

Lat 28. 00 South
Long 42. 00 East

Thursday Feb the 14 1838

These 24 hours begins with squally weather wind from the south middle the wind from the S.E. steered W. as a course latter continues squally So End Lat 28. 50 South Long 40 20 East

Friday Feb the 15. 1838

These 24 hours commences with squally weather wind from the eastward course west watches employed in taking in and making sail middle part the wind hauled out to the south braced the yards and set studding sails latter part took in studding sails and braced sharp to the wind headed W. by N. So Ends Lat 30. 00 South Long 35. 00 East

Saturday Feb the 16. 1838

These 24 hours commences with strong southerly winds and rugged headed W. by S. watches employed in ships duty middle part double reef the top sails latter part more moderate made all sail headed W by the wind So Ends

Lat 30. 00 South
Long by Chron. 33. 40 East
By Sun 32. 40 East

Sunday Feb the 17. 1838

These 24 hours fine and pleasant with all sail set steering W. by the wind middle part the wind hauled more to the south steered W. by S. as a course latter part the wind hauled to the east set studding sails fore and aft So Ends

Lat 31. 00 South
Long 31. 55 East

Monday Feb the 18. 1838

This day commences with fine and pleasant breezes from the eastward course W. S. W. at 2 P.M. saw fire back middle part strong wind and rugged latter part took in studding sails So Ends the 24 hours Lat 42 32. 40 South Long 29. 30 East

Tuesday Feb the 19. 1838

These 24 hours strong breezes and rough course W. S. W. going at the rate of 10 miles an hour middle part squally and the weather wind baffling latter part the wind out south took in studding sails and steered by the wind headed S. S. W. So Ends Lat 34. 27 South Long 25. 12 East

Wednesday Feb the 20. 1838

These 24 hours strong breezes and thick weather wind from the southward middle part heavy squalls and rugged took in fore an mizen topsails and dore reef the main top sail at 10 P.M. were ship headed W. by N. lying to at 1. a.m. set the fore an mizen top sails S. S. E. W. set the main sail an set at 9. A.M. saw a sail to the windward steering east latter part made sail So Ends Lat 34. 30 South Long 28. 00 East
