

March the 15. 1838

These 24 hours commences with fine and pleasant weather the captain sent of word to have short and get ready for sea at 8. P.M. took our anchor and run into the gorge porters carried away her sparsid yard and stove in some of her bulworks latter part the morning the island out of sight So Ends Lat. 14.45. South Long. 6:40 West

March the 16. 1838

These 24 hours fine and pleasant S.E. trades a ship in sight a head steering S.W. by S. middle and latter part weather much the same So Ends these 24 hours Lat. 12.30 South Long 8.10 West

March the 17. 1838

These 24 hours commences with fine and pleasant trades from the S.E. course S.S. by S. one ship in sight steering the same course middle and latter part freshens So Ends Lat. 11.00 South Long 10.05 West

March the 18. 1838

These 24 hours commences with strong S.E. trades course S.S. by S. one ship in sight steering the same middle part lower studding sails on both sides latter part the wind light So Ends Lat. 10.20 South Long 12.00 West

March the 19. 1838

These 24 hours commences with fine and pleasant trades from the S.E. course S.S. by S. one ship in sight middle and latter part much the same So Ends these 24 hours Lat. 9.20 South Long 13:40 West

March the 20. 1838

All these 24 hours light airs from the S.E. course S.S. by S. at 5 P.M. made the island of senion bearing S.W. by S. 8 leagues distance at 16 run in a breast of the town saw three merchant vessels lying to anchor to english and one french H.M. steered S.S. by S. a fine steady breeze At 12 the harbour bore S. by E. 20 miles distance So Ends Lat. 7.38 South Long 14.16 West

March the 21. 1838

These 24 hours commences with fine and pleasant breezes from the S.E. course S.S. by S. At 2 P.M. assension bore S. by E. 35 miles distance middle and latter part much the same So Ends these 24 hours Lat 6.40 South Long 15.50 West
