These 24 hours commences with rough squally weather headed S. N. W. under double reef top sail middle and latter part more moderate shade all sail so ends this day

Lat 33. 00 North

Long 67. 15 West

April the 23. 1835

These 24 hours commences with heavy gales from S. W. headed N. S. W. by the wind latter part headed S. W. as a course with all sail set to the best advantage so ends this day

Lat 34. 20 North

Long 68. 00 West

April the 24. 1835

All these 24 hours strong breezes from the Northward middle part the wind hauled out S. S. steered S. S. W. as a course so ends these 24 hours

Lat 35. 00 North

Long 69. 25 West

April the 25. 1835

These 24 hours commences with thick weather wind from S. S. course S. S. W. middle part squally latter the wind baffling so ends this day

Lat 36. 53 N

Long 70. 58 W

April the 26. 1835

All these 24 hours had a good run to the Northward middle and latter part saw several sails steering to the S. W. so ends this day

Lat 38. 53 N

Long 71. 40 W
