

Tuesday Feb^{ry} 18th 1840.

Commences with light breeze from S.W. continues so through the day watch employed in ship's duty
Saw finbacks

Wednesday Feb^{ry} 19th -

Commences with a fine breeze from S.E. continues so through the day. At 1 o'clock P.M. saw a sail on our weather beam. which went out of sight again. At 3 P.M. raised blackfish did not lower.

Thursday Feb^{ry} 20th -

Commences with a strong breeze from S.E. and continues so through the day fine weather and no whales. watch employed in ship's duty

Friday Feb^{ry} 21st -

Commences with a strong breeze from S.E. continues the same through the day watch employed in ship's duty

Saturday Feb^{ry} 22^d -

Commences with a strong breeze from S.E. latter part of the day moderates in the evening a light squall of rain watch employed in ship's duty

Sunday Feb^{ry} 23^d -

Commences with a light breeze from S.E. continues so through the day. Staining doing to day

Monday Feb^{ry} 24th 1840

Commences with a fine breeze from S.E. and continues so through the day. watch employed in fitting a new boat

Tuesday Feb^{ry} 25th -

Commences with a strong breeze from S.E. continues the same through the day. watch employed in fitting a new boat.

Wednesday Feb^{ry} 26th

Commences with a strong breeze from S.E. heading S.W. with all sail set middle and latter part the same

Thursday Feb^{ry} 27th

Commences with a strong breeze from S.E. by S heading S.W. by S. middle and latter part the same saw 2 sails

Friday Feb^{ry} 28th

Commences with a light breeze from the same quarter and continues so through the day

Saturday Feb^{ry} 29th

Commences with light wind from E.S. steering S.E. East as a course middle and latter part the same

Sunday March 1st 1840.

Commences with strong breezes from the Eastward steering S.E. as a course middle and latter part the same. Saw a ship standing to the Southward
