Commences with strong breeze from the Eastward. At 3 P.M. made Trinidad bearing S E. -

Tuesday March 3rd.

Commences with a light breeze steering S E middle part of the day breezes an

Wednesday March 4th

Commences with light breeze and continues so through the day.

Thursday March 5th

Commences with a breeze continues so through the day course S E for Cape Holland.

Friday March 6th

Commences with a light breeze at 3 P.M. raised a shoal of sperm whales lowered and got fast with 3 boats waist boat drawn. fastened again and took one along side Starboard boat lost line and whale Starboard Boat took one along side. ~~Starboard Boat~~

Saturday March 7th

Commences with strong breezes and squally at 4 P.M. began to hoil middle and latter part breezing on double reefed the topsails

Sunday March 8th

This day commences with strong breezes from S E steering along on the wind middle and latter part moderated made sail and stood along

Monday March 9th 1840.

This day commences with strong breezes from S E. Some sea on saw a sail standing along on the wind middle and latter part strong breezes and squally

Tuesday March 10th

This day commences with light breezes and continues this through the day

Wednesday March 11th

This day commences with light breezes from the old stand middle and latter part the same

Thursday March 12th

This day commences with light breezes which still stick by the old stand watches employed in ships duty middle and latter parts the same

Friday March 13th

This day commences with light breezes from same continue this through the day

Saturday March 14th

This day commences with light breezes from S E and continues so through the day fine weather for whaling but no whales

Sunday March 15th

This day commences with fresh breezes and frequent squalls continues the same through day
