

Saturday, March 28th 1840.

This column commences with a strong breeze from the Northward steering to the Southward middle and latter part of the day more moderate

Sunday March 29th

This day commences with a light breeze from N by E. Ship heading along about S E middle of the day commences breezing latter part strong breezes and rugged

Monday March 30th

This day commences with a strong breeze from the Westward and rugged middle of the day moderate latter foggy.

Tuesday March 31st

This day commences with a light breeze from the Westward continues so through the day. fine weather for whaling.

Wednesday April 1st 1840.

This day commences with a light breeze from the N W steering E S E as a course middle and latter parts the same

Thursday April 2nd

This day commences with a light breeze from W N steering E S E as a course middle and latter parts the same

Friday April 3rd 1840.

This day commences with light breezes midday commences breezing on latter part strong breezes

Saturday April 4th

This day commences with a strong breeze it still increasing finally terminates in a gale with heavy squalls latter part of day took in sail.

Sunday April 5th

This day commences with strong breezes with frequent squalls middle and latter part the same

Monday April 6th

This day commences with strong breezes the gale has somewhat abated so that we make sail and stand along about our business middle and latter parts more moderate.

Tuesday April 7th

This day commences with a light breeze midday the wind dies. latter part a calm.

Wednesday April 8th

This day commences with light baffling winds continues so through the day

Thursday April 9th

This day commences with a light breeze midday breezes on latter part strong breezes.
