

Friday April 10th 1840

This day commences with light breezes and ends with the same

Saturday April 11th

This day commences with light breezes the wind shifting steering ESE as a course all sail set midday and latter part the same

Sunday April 12th

This day commences with a light breeze and continues thus through the day

Monday April 13th

This commences with a light at midday wind breezes. latter part strong breezes steering ESE as a course made the Island of St Pauls.

Tuesday April 14th

This day commences with a strong breeze continues breezing till quite a gale latter part of the day put the ship under short sail in sight the island

Wednesday April 15th

The gale still increasing it blowing so heavy canvas would not stand took in all sail split the jib fore topmast and mizzen staysails etc 3 or 4 ships a heavy sea on our labourd tack which capsized the galley cock and all stove two boats besides washing away a part of our bulwarks latter part of the it moderating made sail

Thursday April 16th 1840.

This day commences with light puffing breezes and ends with the same

Friday April 17th

This day commences with a light breeze from the northward and torrents of rain steering E by S. as a course. at midday breezes on strong the wind coming out NE took in sail ship heading ESE to the wind

Saturday April 18th

This day commences with a gale of wind and ends with the same ship lying to under close reefed main topsail. and fore and mizzen staysails

Sunday April 19th

This day commences with a heavy gale from NW. lying too under mizzen sail middle of the day the gale decreases latter part made sail

Monday April 20th

This day commences with a light breeze from WSW. steering ESE as a course all sail set latter part of the day winds hauls out NW a fine breeze

Tuesday April 21st

This day commences with a light breeze from SE steering ESE as a course middle and latter part strong breezes
