

Tuesday May 19th 1840.

Commences with a light breeze. At 4th finished stowing down middle and latter parts pleasant saw whales lowered the boats without success. Lat. 27.30. S

Wednesday May 20th Long. 108. 30. W

Commences with light winds and ends with the same. At 3 P.M. saw whales lowered the boats did not get fast

Thursday May 21st

Commences with light winds and ends the same plenty of fin backs in sight

Friday May 22nd

1840, 4 24
1841, 7 2

Commences with moderate breezes middle and latter parts strong breezes

Saturday May 23rd

Commences with light winds and ends with the same

Sunday May 24th

Commences with light winds and ends with the same

Monday May 25th

Commences with light breezes and continues thus through the day

Tuesday May 26th

Commences with light winds watches employed in painting ship. Saw a ship to windward ends with light breezes

Wednesday May 27th

Commences with light breezes and ends with the same finished painting ship. Saw a ship to windward

Thursday May 28th 1840.

Commences with light winds at sunrise saw a shoal of sperm whales but they were going to quick did not lower

Friday May 29th Lat 28. 22. S

Commences with light winds and ends with the same.

Saturday May 30th

Commences with light winds and ends with the same saw a ship to windward

Sunday May 31st

Commences with fresh breezes and ends with the same

Monday June 1st

Commences with strong breezes and ends with the same

Tuesday June 2nd

Commences with strong breezes middle and latter parts more moderate

Wednesday June 3rd

Commences with light winds saw sperm whales at 3 P.M. lowered the boats but the whale went down did not come up again until sun down hard luck and no fish & thus ends the day

Thursday June 4th

Commences with strong breezes & ends with the same

Friday June 5th

Commences with strong winds and ends with the same Lat. 28. 20. S

Saturday June 6th

Commences with strong breezes squalls and a rugged sea and continues thus through the day Lat. 29. 27. S
