squalls &c. Tuesday. June. 9th

commences with
heavy ugly weather and ends with the same

Wednesday June. 10th

commences with
strong breezes middle and latter part of the
day more moderate

Thursday. June. 11th

commences with
a light breeze at 2 P.M. saw a sperm whale lowered
the boats and took him along side to the S.B.

Friday. June 12th

commences with
a fine cutting breeze finished at 3 P.M. & began
to boil. Saturday. June. 13th

commences with
baffling airs and calms at 9 P.M. finished boiling
at 10. & 11. saw sperm whales lowered and
took one to the S.B. & one to the L.B. good luck.

Sunday. June. 14th

commences with
light airs & fine weather. commenced cutting
at sunset lashed down

Monday June 15th

commences with
light breezes commenced cutting at daylight
at sundown finished and began to
boil thus ends a good days work.

Tuesday. June. 16th 1840.

commences with
latter part squally with rain all hands
employed in boiling out our blubber.

Wednesday. June. 17th

commences with
light breezes and squalls of rain middle and
latter parts strong breezes finished boiling

Thursday. June. 18th

commences with
fine breezes and continues thus through
the day stowing down oil —

Friday. June. 19th

commences with
pleasant gales and ends with the same
finished stowing down our oil.

Saturday. June. 20th

commences with
light breezes and ends with the same

Sunday. June. 21st

commences with
fine whaling breezes and ends with the same

Monday. June. 22nd

commences with
strong breezes and squalls & ends with
light winds and pleasant weather. what a
contrast Tuesday. June. 23rd

commences with
light winds at 9 A.M. saw a shoal of sperm
whales lowered the boats and took one to
the boat and took and took him along side

Wednesday. June. 24th

commences with
light winds commenced cutting in our
whale middle and latter parts squally
did not finish cutting in
