

Thursday June 25th 1840.

Commences with strong breezes. took in our whales head and began to boil. the day ends with strong breezes

Friday June 26th

Commences with strong breezes and rugged and ends with the same. at 4 o'clock finished boiling.

Saturday June 27th

Commences with strong breezes and ends with the same

Sunday June 28th

Commences with light winds and ends with the same

Monday June 29th

Commences with light winds. at daylight commenced stowing down the day ends with pleasant weather

Tuesday June 30th

Commences with strong breezes and ends with the same at sunset finished stowing down our last sperm whale

Wednesday July 1st

Commences with breezes middle and latter parts more moderate

Thursday July 2^d

Commences with light winds middle and latter parts the same

Friday July 3^d Lat. 26° 5'. Long. 104° 26' E.

Commences with fine breezes. at 4 o'clock saw a school of sperm whales. lowered the boats and took one small whale from amongst an innumerable school and took him along side to the S.B. at daylight commenced cutting at 10 o'clock finished. thus ends the day

Saturday July 4th 1840.

Commences with light breezes. commenced boiling. the day ends with fine weather

Sunday July 5th

Commences with light winds. middle and latter parts quite a strong breeze

Monday July 6th

Commences with a light breeze and ends with the same

Tuesday July 7th

Commences with a strong breeze. middle part breezing. latter part something of a gale

Wednesday July 8th

Commences with a strong breeze middle moderates a little latter part a strong breeze

Thursday July 9th

Commences with a strong breeze and ends with the same and a very heavy sea running.

Friday July 10th

Commences with a moderate breeze and ends with the same

Saturday July 11th

Commences with a strong breeze latter part more moderate

Sunday July 12th

Commences with a strong breeze and ends with the same

Monday July 13th

Commences with strong breezes middle and latter parts more moderate
