Sunday 11th

Light winds from W. latter part strong gales

Monday 12th

Strong gales from W. middle moderates. latter strong winds

Tuesday 13th

Strong gales from W. laying to under short sail

Wednesday 14th

Strong gales from S.W. & rugged latter part moderates

Thursday 15th

Light winds from N. course S.W. middle strong breeze

latter parts light winds & foggy

Friday 16th

Light winds & foggy ends with the same

Saturday 17th

Light airs & foggy continues thus through the day

Sunday 18th

Light winds from W. course N.E. by E. ends with strong rain

Monday 19th

commences with strong breezes & squally wind S.W. by E.

course S.W. by E. middle & latter part light winds

Tuesday 20th

Light winds from S.W. middle & latter part strong breeze

Wednesday 21st

Strong breezes from South. middle & latter the same

Thursday 22nd

Strong breeze from W.W. course S.S.W. double reefed the top sail

Friday 23rd

Strong breeze saw right whale lowered & got on W.B.

Saturday 24th

Strong breezes at 2 P.M. commenced cutting at sundown finished & commenced boiling thus ends

Sunday 25th

Strong breezes from S.W. & rugged middle & latter part the same at 10 A.M. finished boiling

Monday 26th of Oct. ¹⁸⁴⁰

commences with

strong breezes & foggy. at daylight lay on to store down oil ends with strong breezes & rain.

Tuesday 27th

Strong breezes from N.W. at 5 P.M. finished storing down middle & latter part light winds.

Wednesday 28th

Light winds from N.E. middle part the same at 1 P.M. saw a right whale lowered did not get fast

Thursday 29th

Fresh breezes from W. middle & latter the same

Friday 30th

Light winds middle & latter parts strong breezes

Saturday 31st

Strong wind from S.W. middle & latter parts the same saw two ships spoke the Barga Parthian F.R.

Sunday Oct. ^{1st} 1840.

Light winds & foggy some rain latter light winds a sail in sight

Monday 2nd

Commences with light winds ends with the same sail in sight

Tuesday 3rd

Light winds. at noon saw a school of sperm whales lowered the boats but could not get fast at 4 P.M. saw a right whale

Wednesday 4th

Light winds through the day one ship in sight. thus ends

Thursday 5th

Light winds. spoke the Cadmus at London Capt. Chickerson 4 men sick. at 10 A.M. saw whales lowered. Sturboner B.

got fast the tug dragged went on board as usual

Friday 6th

Light winds. at 4 P.M. saw whales lowered got none. Ship Cadmus in sight lost one man with fever this morning

at 6 A.M. saw whales lowered at 9 A.M. lowered again got none

Saturday 7th

Strong breezes saw a sperm whale lowered fastened lost a line, &c. Ship Cadmus took a right whale. thus ends.
