

Wednesday, March 24th 1841—

Strong breeze through the day spoke ship Liverpool Capt Thomas Portugee 9 m. 1100 right whale oil thus ends.

Thursday 25th—

Moderate breeze through the day &c. thus ends.

Friday 26th—

Commenced with a strong breeze at 8 AM raised a shoal of sperm whales. At 1 PM lowered got 1 to the L. Lat 27° 50' S Long 108° 00' E.

Saturday 27th—

Strong breeze through the day at daylight commenced cutting. At 11 AM finished. At 1 PM started the works Lat 26° 00' S Long 108° 25' E.

Sunday 28th—

Strong breeze through the day. At 4 PM finished boiling Lat 26° 11' S Long 106° 41' E.

Monday 29th—

Light breeze through the day Lat 27° 30' S Long 107° 05' E.

Tuesday 30th—

Light breeze all day at daylight commenced stowing. At 5 PM finished.

Wednesday 31st—

Commenced with strong breeze raised sperm whales lowered but run of the whales went on board & got nothing Lat 25° 16' S Long 105° 34' E.

Thursday April 1st 1841—

Commenced with strong breeze middle and latter part the same Lat 24° 34' S Long 100° 22' E.

Friday 2nd—

Commenced with strong winds middle and latter part the same Lat 23° 12' S Long 100° 13' E.

Saturday 3rd—

Commenced with strong winds middle and latter part the same a sail in sight Lat 20° 16' S Long 100° 13' E.

Sunday 4th—

Commenced with light winds middle and latter part the same Lat 20° 23' S Long 100° 13' E.

Long 100° 13' E.

Monday 5th April 1841.

Commenced with light winds at 9 AM. Saw sperm whales toward the boats and got one at 2 PM. Beganto cut at 4. Finished middle and latter part fine weather.

Lat 25° 46' S

Long 100° 32' E.

Tuesday 6th—

Commenced with light winds all hands employed in boiling middle and latter part the same Lat 25° 59' S

Long 100° 30' E.

Wednesday 7th—

Commenced with light winds at 3 AM. Finished boiling middle and latter part the same Lat 26° 18' S

Long 100° 40' E.

Thursday 8th—

Commenced with light winds and Rain. Middle and latter part the same.

Friday 9th—

Commenced with light winds middle and latter part the same Lat 28° S

Long 100° 40' E.

Saturday 10th—

Commenced with light winds at daylight began to stow down oil. 3 PM finished latter part the same Lat 28° 10' S

Long 107° 20' E.

Sunday 11th—

Commenced with light winds middle and latter part the same a sail in sight Lat 28° 41' S

Long 107° 30' E.
