Strong breeze through the day at 3 PM spoke ship Leonidas Fairhaven 18 m. out 900 lbs sperm then cutting 2 whales which was taken the day previous Lat 25.24 S Long. 108.08 W

Friday 28th

Strong breeze through the day Lat 22.42 S Long. 108.16 W

Saturday 29th

Moderate all day at 3 PM spoke ship Hercules crew Bedford Capt Kieketson. 21 m. 200 lbs. Likewise the Barque London Packet of New Bedford Capt Sumson. 6 m. 100 lbs. sperm Lat 22.15 S Long. 107.30 W

Sunday 30th

Com with light breeze middle & latter parts the same saw 5 ships to windward spoke none Lat 22.39 S Long. 107.45 W

Monday 31st

Com with light breeze Vends with the same Lat 22.15 S Long. 107.02 W

Tuesday June 1st 1841—

Strong breeze latter part rainy & squally Lat 22.28 S Long. 107.08 W

Wednesday 2nd

Strong breeze through the day plenty of finbacks Lat 23.01 S Long. 107.45 W

Thursday 3rd

Com with light breeze Vends the same Lat 23.10 S Long. 107.43 W

Friday 4th

Light breeze through the day at 5 PM raised a dead whale to leeward steered for & came up with it about dusk lowered the S.B. took a view of it it was good for nothing Lat 22.25 S Long. 107.26 W

Saturday 5th

Com Vends with a light breeze. 6 ship to windward Lat 23.00 S Long. 107.20 W

Sunday 6th

Light breeze through the day at day light spoke ship Merimack. Newburyport. Starbuck at 10 spoke the the Maria 22 m. 300 lbs at 3 PM raised whales chased 2 of none Lat 22.40 S Long. 107.15 W

Tuesday 8th

Light breeze through the day 5 ships to leeward. Lat 22.30 S Long. 108.14 W

Wednesday 9th

Com with light breeze ends with the same Lat 22.32 S Long. 107.51 W

Thursday 10th

Light breeze through the day one ship in sight Lat 21.42 S Long. 107.10 W

Friday 11th

Moderate breeze to day spoke ship Herald Capt D 10 m out 1100 lbs oil. Lat 21.49 S Long. 106.54 W

Saturday 12th

Light breeze through the day spoke Barque Roscoe of New Bedford ~~James~~ Clark. 23 m 1100 lbs. 400 sperm Maria Theresa New Bedford. 14 m 1400. 400 sperm Lat 21.54 S Long. 107.04 W

Com with light breeze Vends with same Lat 22.10 S Long. 107.30 W

First & middle light breeze & rainy latter pleasant

Com with light breeze middle & latter strong breeze with rain Lat 23.12 S Long. 105.00 W

Com with strong breeze from S by E steering W by N for the Isle of France middle & latter parts squally & rainy

Thursday 17th

Strong breeze all day from S by S steering W by N. As a course

Friday 18th

First strong breeze. latter squally land at by steering W by N Lat 23.40 S Long. 97.11 W

Saturday 19th

Com with a light breeze from S by W steering W by N Lat 23.47 S Long. 94.32 W

Sunday 20th

Light breeze through the day from S by S. course W by N. at 11 AM lowered the S.B. & lanced a finback Lat 23.08 S Long. 94.09 W
