 called all hands and broke out the fore hole to find a
 leak in our oil at 11 AM finished (not finding any leak)
 and commenced breaking out our after hole found no
 leak. At 9 AM a brig crossed our bows & showed French
 colours latter part of the day quite a breeze.
 Thursday 9th 1 First & latter strong breeze. latter light
 finished breaking out & stowed down off found no leak.
 Friday 10th 1 Com with a moderate breeze & ends
 with the same stopped a leak in a cask of oil in the run
 Saturday 11th 1 Light breeze through the day Lat. 27.13 S
 Sunday 12th 1 Pleasant breeze through the day at
 6 AM. Othman Allen our cooper died was buried at 1/2 p.m.
 Monday 13th 1 Fine weather all day employed in mending sails
 Tuesday 14th 1 Light breeze all day employed in fitting breezes
