

Wednesday. Oct. 20th 1841.

First & middle light breeze latter strong from W. At sundown saw right whales did not lower. Long 40.09⁷.

Thursday 21st Strong breeze through the day at 3 P.M. raised right whales lowered without success. Long 42.30⁷.

Friday 22nd Strong breeze. middle & latter moderate.

Saturday 23rd Moderate through the day. Long 41.31⁷.

Sunday 24th Strong winds & rainy at 2 P.M. raised right whales lowered struck & lost a line. Sat. 34.29⁵.

Monday 25th Corn with strong breeze saw whales

lowered the boats without success latter part rainy & rugged

Tuesday 26th Light winds through the day at 4 P.M. raised right whales lowered & struck to the L.B. took him along side & cut him in. lost his head. Sat. 34.30⁵.

Wednesday 27th Light wind. at 7 A.M. lowered for whales without success at 1 P.M. raised more whales lowered and took one alongside. Corn cutting of sundown lashed down. Sat. 34.32⁵.

Thursday 28th Strong breeze & equally finished cutting.

& began to boil middle & latter part the same. Ends

Friday 29th Strong breeze. at 8 A.M. lowered & got a whale took him alongside. commencing at 3 P.M. finished

Saturday 30th Light breeze through the day & foggy weather all hands employed in boiling & stowing down oil

Sunday 31st Light breeze at 1 P.M. lowered for whales & took one alongside & cut him still boiling

Monday Nov. 1st Strong breeze boiling & stowing oil

Tuesday 2nd Strong breeze through the day lowered for whales took one alongside & cut him in. ends

Wednesday 3rd Strong breeze Boiling & stowing down

Thursday 4th Strong winds through the day Boiling & stowing down lowered struck & drewed ends

Friday 5th Strong breeze saw plenty of whales. Sat. 34.51⁵

Saturday 6th Strong breeze & rainy through the day at 3 P.M.

Sunday 7th Light winds at 8 P.M. raised whales lowered struck one & drewed & went on board

Monday 8th Fine weather raised whales lowered the boats took one alongside & cut him in one sail in sight

Tuesday Nov. 9th 1841.

Strong gales Boiling. Saw plenty of whales Long 69.20

Wednesday 10th Light winds through the day raised whales lowered the boats but without success

Thursday 11th Strong winds & rugged through the day. At daylight Corn stowing down oil at 2 P.M. lowered for whales without success 2 sails in sight.

Friday 12th Light winds all day raised whales lowered the boats struck to the S.B. got stove & lost the whole 2 ships in sight thus ends

Saturday 13th Moderate through the day. At 6 A.M. raised whales lowered & took one alongside cut him in & commenced boiling.

Sunday 14th At 4 A.M. gale of wind. At 8 A.M. cooled down all hands went below one sail in sight. Sat. 35.08⁵

Monday 15th Strong breeze through the day. At daylight started the works. lowered for whales got none. At 1 P.M. cooled down. At 3 P.M. started the works & finished boiling lying to under close reefed main topsail saw plenty of whales

Tuesday 16th Strong winds. stowing down. a sail in sight. Sat. 35.01⁵ Long 46.15⁷

Wednesday 17th

Strong winds. At daylight commenced stowing down oil spoke the ship Ann Maria New London. Conn. 600. W. 24

Thursday 18th At 4 A.M. gale of wind all day one sail in sight thus ends

Friday 19th Light winds through the day at 3 P.M. lowered for whales & took one alongside & cut him thus ends the day

Saturday 20th Strong winds through the day commenced boiling. Ends

Sunday 21st Light winds through the day one sail in sight. finished boiling.

Monday 22nd Fine weather through the day. At 11 A.M. spoke ship Mayflower New Bedford 4 1/2 m. 40th whale at 6 P.M. lowered for whales got none
