

Thursday. 23rd of Nov. 1841 -

Commenced stowing down
At 2 P.M. raised whale lowered without success

Wednesday. 24th - Strong winds
through the day. At 8 P.M. raised a gam of right whale
lowered & got 1 to the L.B. took along side & cut him in

Thursday 25th - Strong winds
through the day took in the Waist Boat. Lat. 34. 3' 15"

Friday 26th - at gale through the day.

Saturday 27th - Moderating a
little. At 3 P.M. started the works. this ends

Sunday 28th Fine weather through
the day raised whales lowered got fast to the S.B. the
whale leading them out of town cut & went on board

Monday 29th - Light wind raised
whales lowered struck to the L.B. took the whale to the ship
Lat. 34. 39' S Long. 70. 41' W.

Tuesday 30th - Clear & winds, with strong
winds cut in our whale & commenced boiling.

Wednesday Dec 1st 1841 -

Fine weather through the day At 8 P.M. lowered
for whales got 1 to the L.B. took him along side & cut him in Lat. 34. 51'

Thursday 2nd -

Light winds through the day raised a whale lowered & struck
to the L.B. took him along side. spoke Ship Mayflower

Friday 3rd -

Strong winds through the day saw whales. com boiling Lat. 34. 29'

Saturday 4th -

Light winds & foggy watches employed in stowing down

Sunday 5th -

Fine breeze through the day. Spoke the Ship Lucas
of New Bedford. 2 P.M. out. 15 P.M. -

Monday 6th -

Light breeze employed in stowing down Lucas in right

Tuesday. Dec 8th 1841.

Fine breeze through the
day bobbing along to the eastward saw fin backs

Wednesday 8th - Fine weather through
the day At 2 P.M. raised right whales lowered took a
calf along side to the S.B. cut him in & com boiling

Thursday 9th - Fine breeze through
the day. Watches employed in handling bone

Friday 10th - Strong breeze through
the day. At 11 P.M. finished boiling. then ends -

Saturday 11th - Light breeze through
the day all hands employed in stowing down oil -

Sunday 12th - Fine breeze from N.W.
heaving along by the vessel. At 5 P.M. one of the foremast
hands damaged duty. tied his hands & put him in confinement

Monday 13th - Bound Home with a
light breeze from Eastward steering N.W. by E as a course

Tuesday 14th - Light breeze steering N.W.

Wednesday 15th - Light breeze through
the day. watches employed in bending sails

Thursday 16th - Light breeze through the
day watches employed in sailing ship -

Friday 17th - Light breeze through the
day. watches employed in fitting rigging

Saturday 18th - Strong breeze through
the day. course N.W. watches employed in ships clutter

Sunday 19th - First part light breezes
middle & latter strong breezes. Lat. 31. 37' S. -

Monday 20th - Strong breeze through the day

Tuesday 21st - Moderate breezes through
the day watches employed in painting ship
