

Wednesday Feb. 2^d 1842 - mistake

Sunday 6th - Light breeze through the day. At 8 am took our anchor & stood to sea course N

Monday 7th - Moderate gales through the day from S. 2 Ships in sight.

Tuesday 8th - Pleasant gales through the day course N.W. 2 Ships in sight

Wednesday 9th - Light breeze through the day from S. course N.W. this ends

Thursday 10th - Com^d ends with light breeze Spoke the Ship Mary New Bedford Capt went on board. dined & took tea. ends these 24 hours

Friday 11th - Strong breeze through the day. the Mary in sight this ends these 24 hours

Saturday 12th - Strong breeze through the day watches employed in fitting ~~fitting~~ rigging

Sunday 13 - First part moderate middle & latter part strong breeze off 4 & 8 m. raised a shoal of sperm whales lowered struck to the SB whale rounding took the line & walked off SB struck killed her whale & took him alongside made him fast. the Mary gone on ahead

Monday 14th - Strong breeze through the day At daylight commenced cutting & finished at sundown. A brace days work for crackups At 8 PM commenced boiling. there was these 24 hours wind. N.E. course N.W. by N. ends

Tuesday Feb. 15th 1842 -

Strong breeze through the day. At sundown finished boiling our whale which turned up 30 blb. that is not so dusty

Wednesday 16th - First part strong breeze middle & latter parts much the same wind S.E. course N.W. by N. all hands employed in stowing down our whale between decks. this ends

Thursday 17th - Com^d with light breeze middle & latter parts strong breeze from S.W. course N.W. ends these 24 hours

Friday 18th - Light breeze through the day watches employed in scraping ship &

Saturday 19th - Com^d with light breeze middle & latter parts calm employed in painting ship. Course N.W. Lat. 3.30 S. Long. 22.44 W.

Sunday 20th - First & middle light breeze from N.E. course N.W. by N. latter part calm Lat. 2.53 S. Long. 23.10 W.

Monday 21st - First part light breeze middle & latter stronger baffling & squally. Lat. 2.05 S. Long. 24.00 W.

Tuesday 22^d - Com^d ends with light baffling winds attended with squalls & rain Lat. 1.05 S. Long. 24.40 W.

Wednesday 23^d - Com^d with light winds & squalls middle & latter parts calm ends

Thursday 24th - Light winds & squally through the day. 2 sails in sight. Lat. 1.45 S. Long. 25.00 W.
