At 6 A.M. the Pilot came on board and made preparations for our departure at 8 A.M. we took our anchor with a fine breeze from N.E. at 9 A.M. the pilot left and we proceeded onward so ends this day

Fine breezes from the Eastward and good weather employed in stowing the anchors and clearing up decks steering ship S.S.E. middle part fine breeze from S.W. & ashore heading S.E. by S at 2 A.M. calm latter part light air and calms coiled 3 lines so ends this day 2 sail in sight

Remarks

Monday the 17<sup>th</sup> 1844

These 24 hours commences with a light breeze from S.W. steering ship E. middle and latter part fine breezes and good weather steering ship E by S set fore and main topgallant sails saw several sails and sun fish employed in fitting the boats so ends this day Lat 40° 18' N
