

Ship Hibernia at Sea

June

Sunday the 30th 1844

Commenced with light breezes from N. steering E & E
bent a new sling jib at 4 P.M. fell in with and
old wreck the Brig Sterling towed a boat and
went on board of her had 2 anchors on deck it
being near night we did not try to save them
caught plenty of fish got 2 cast iron sawyer holes
middle and latter part light breezes from the westward
steering E & E 2 sail in sight steering the same
our sick men are better Lat 39.23

Ship Hibernia at Sea

July

Monday the 1st 1844

Light breezes from W. steering E & E middle and
latter light breezes at 5 A.M. saw the Land
Floras bearing E & E distance about 10 leagues got up
the cables and bent them got one anchor ready
at 10 A.M. spoke ship Columbia of New London
13 days out 2 blackfish Lat 39.34

July

Tuesday the 2nd 1844

Light breezes from the westward at 2 P.M.
the Capt went on shore got one hog & pig one
goat sold one barrel of Blackfish oil at
9 P.M. put away for St. John's middle and
latter part good weather reversed sail in sight
steering S & E by S 1/2 S wind from the Westward
shipd one man at Flores Lat 39.00
Long 31.00

July

Wednesday the 3rd

Light breezes spr. S. bearing S & E distance 10 leagues
at 6 P.M. spoke ship Bertha of Providence 32
days out clear steering ship E & E for St. John's
at 2 P.M. hauled aboard at 3 P.M. in Lat 39.00
the Capt went on shore light breezes and fine
weather lying off and on
