

Ship Hibernia at Sea

July 1844

Wednesday the 10th
Light breezes and good weather saw
St. George and Pico and plenty of porpoises
middle part a light breeze from E. & steering W
latter part fine breezes steering in between Pico
and Fayal employed in fitting a spanker gaff
and rigging saw a breach

July 1844

Thursday the 11th

Light air and calms ship in between Pico and
Fayal employed in ship's duty at 1 P.M. a breeze
from the Eastward ship heading to the southward
latter part fresh breezes took in fore and
mizen topgallant sails and flew jib fitting
the spanker gaff and boom Lat 37° 25'

July 1844

Friday the 12th

Fresh breezes from the Eastward ship
heading to the southward saw white
water and a sail steering W middle
and latter part fresh breezes heading to the
southward employed in fitting the spanker
boom and gaff so ends no other

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Saturday the 13th
Commenced with fresh breezes from the Eastward
ship heading S by E finished the spanker boom
and sent the sail back out for water
middle and latter part moderate breezes made
all sail employed in ship's duty Lat 28° 30'
one man sick this day P.M. is aboard
for washing fresh ^{water} aboard

July 1844

Sunday the 14th

Fine breezes from the Eastward ship heading
S by E middle and latter part light breezes
and good weather saw a ship steering S.W.
Lat 31° 10'
Long 35° 04'

July 1844

Monday the 15th

Light breezes from E ship heading S by E
with all sail set middle part light breeze
latter part light breeze from S by E steering
ship S by E employed in ship's duty
all hands well
