

Ship Hibernia at Sea.

July 1844

Sunday the 28th
Light breezes from WNW steering S cut
up the black fish and washed off the decks
at 6 P.M. set studding sails middle and latter
part fine weather so ends Lat 40 54
Long 20 52

July 1844

Monday the 29th

Light breezes from WNW and pleasant
weather steering S at 3 P.M. spoke with
the Brig Ellenking of Situate bound to
Boston middle and latter part fine weather
employed in boiling over Blackfish finished
so ends the day steering SSW Lat 40 21

July 1844

Tuesday the 30th

Light wind from the Northward and Westward
steering ship to the southward at 6 P.M. squally
with plenty of rain took in the studding sails
flying up fore and mizen top gallant sail
middle and latter part squally with showers
of rain took in the main top gallant sail
and reefed the mizen top sail at 4 P.M. weather
more moderate made all sail so ends

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July 1844

Wednesday the 31st
Fresh breezes from SSW ship heading S S E
at 3 P.M. the fore top sail yard came down
the eye bolt drew out of the top that the
hal yards were attached to. Manuel Roderick
was on the yard on the look out he fell
overboard a boat was lowered away as
quick as possible but we saw him no more
middle part fresh breezes at 4 P.M. tacked ship
heading W by S latter part the same saw 2 sail
on the other tack so ends Lat 40 04

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
