Tuesday the 3rd

Fresh breezes from W and good weather steering E by S
employed in painting the new boat middle and latter
part fresh breezes from the westward steering E repaired
the fore topmast staysail Lat 43° 44'

January 1845

Wednesday the 1st

Commenced with strong breezes from NW
steering E by S at 4 P.M. saw 12 right whales
luffed to the wind and took in sail to start
which were ahead at 9 P.M. were ship heading
to the Northward middle part weather with
rain at daylight middle part saw nothing
but fin backs kept her off E latter part fresh
breezes from W by N steering E by S

Long 123° 00' by Chron
123° 36' by Lunar

January 1845

Thursday the 2nd

Strong breezes and raged of tories E by S
middle and latter part the same employed
in sundries steering E by S

Lat 43° 3'
Long 127° 26' by Chron
127° 05' by one Lunar
127° 37' by the other

January 1844

Friday the 3rd

Strong breezes from the westward
steering E by S middle and latter part
a gale with squally steering E by S
no ends no more
