

Ship Hibernia at Sea at P. Simmons Master

January 1844

Saturday the 4th

A light gale from the westward steering
E & middle and latter part moderate
all sail set except the main sail to
repair found the foreland loose killed it

Lat 44° 16'
Long 134° 50'

January 1844

Sunday the 5th

A fine breeze from the westward steering
East and set out with middle and latter
part the same at 7 o'clock spoke the
Ship France of Harver 5 miles & whales

Lat 44° 20'
Long 134° 20'

January 1845

Monday the 6th

Light breeze from the westward steering
E middle and latter part fresh breezes
this day finished the main sail and bent
it

this day threaded overboard the 3d barrel of
Stinking Beef

Lat 44° 35'
Long 144° 30'

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Tuesday the 7th

Fresh breezes from N. E. steering E. S. saw plenty
of porpoises got one at 7 o'clock disabled
broke the foremast and kept to N. E.
at daylight kept off E and made sail better
part fresh breezes and rain

Lat 46° 16'
Long 143° 51'
at 9 o'clock

January 1845

Wednesday the 8th

Strong breezes with rain at 6 o'clock
took in sail to close reefed main
foremast and fore sail middle part fresh
breezes and cloudy at 5 o'clock made sail
steering E. S. & went N. W. off

Lat 44° 35'
Long 144° 10'
at 10 o'clock

January 1845

Thursday the 9th

Fresh breezes from N. W. hauled to the wind
heading N. E. at 3 o'clock wind freshened doubled
up the foremast hauled the fore and main sail
at 3 o'clock took in the fore and main foremast
at 4 o'clock took in the fore and main foremast
at 4 o'clock took in the fore and main foremast
part strong breezes and squally at 5 o'clock kept
off E. S. & at 7 o'clock at 10 o'clock made sail
