

Ship Hibernia at Sea W. P. Simmons Master

January 1845

Friday the 10th

Fresh breeze from the westward steering W
at 3 P.M. saw the land bearing N.W. distance
about 30 miles hauled to the evening, reaching 11 P.M.
saw a sail middle part light breeze from
W. W. ship heading E. by E. latter part light
airs and calm heading along with the land
at 11 P.M. a light breeze from N.E. ship heading N.W.

Lat 41° 32'

Long 148° 40' by Chron
25 miles to the Eastward
of the land

January 1845

Saturday the 11th

Light breezes from the Northward and Eastward
ship heading to the Northward and Westward
with the land at sunset and on our lee beam
distance 12 miles saw a schooner in shore at 9 P.M.
tacked of shore heading E. at 10 P.M. saw a sail at
11 o'clock spoke the "Laurie" of N. London 4 whales
5 men at 12 P.M. part light breezes heading E. in
company with the L

Light breezes from the Northward tacked ship heading
N.W. with all sail set middle part light airs
from N. tacked ship heading E. N.E. at 11 P.M. were

Light air a check weather ship heading
N.W. by N. Lat 8 P.M. tacked to
E. by N. latter part fine breezes and
check weather until 11 P.M. the
clear

Tuesday the 14th

Fresh breeze from N.E. ship heading
E. at 5 P.M. tacked in the topgallant
sails and fair, jibs middle part strong
breeze latter part the same ship heading E.
no ends this day

January 1845

Wednesday the 15th

Strong breezes from the Northward ship
heading E. middle part heading N.E. by E.
latter part E. N.E. and fresh breezes
all sail set Lat 41° 43'
employed in making vines and mats
drive an eye boat into the side of the ship
to back the fore topgallant back stay to
