January 1845

Wednesday the 22nd

Light breeze from W. by N steering N. by E. employed
in repairing the fore sail middle and latter
part light breeze from W. by N steering N. by E
this day made up a board of 34. 10 amongst
all hands for 100 lbs of sperm oil Log 168. 34

January 1845

Thursday the 23rd

Light air from N. by W ship heading N. by E
finishing the fore sail and last middle
and latter part light air and gales break out
for water and cold shocks for rovers
Lat 35. 50

January 1845

Friday the 24th

A light breeze from E. by S ship heading
N. by E. W. middle part light breeze and
bubbling latter part fresh breeze from E. by S
saw 2 caracks doubled reefed the topsails

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Saturday the 25th

Strong breezes and rain fish pondently parted
top the fish unboiled at 8 P.M. leaving
fresh breeze in the fore and main topsails
at 6 P.M. saw a Brig heading to the
westward middle part wind hauled to the
westward gulf made light sail steering E
at day light saw the land the Islands of St. Kitts
middle part light breeze steering for the land
saw a Barge Lat 34. 13
Log by 2 watches 172. 00

January 1845

Sunday the 26th

Light air from West at 1 P.M. the Capt went
on shore at 6 P.M. came on board and
engaged 2 lbs of potatoes for as much
bread middle and latter part fine weather
at day light saw the coast of St. Kitts went
on shore and got over potatoes
Lat 34. 14
Log 173. 00

January 1845

Monday the 27th

Light air and fine weather steering N. by E in
company with the collector and saw 2 sail
middle and latter part light air from W
S. W. steering N. by E last main royal were
new rigging set fore topmast and main top
gallant starting sails
Lat 33. 43
