February 1845

Thursday the 6th

Onmences with a gale moderating at 4 P.M. set
whole top sail at 7 P.M. set the top gallant sail
steering E wind N.W. and fresh middle part
light breezes set studding sail main royal latter
part the same wind S.W. broke out for water
employed in fitting rigging

Long 172° 42' W

February 1845

Friday the 7th

Light breezes from S.W. steering E by S with
light sail set middle part wind hauled to
S.E. ship heading E.S. latter part wind
E.S. heading N.E. by W employed in fitting
rigging got out bread

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Saturday the 8th

Fresh breezes from E.S. ship heading N.E. by
with all sail set saw porpoises middle part
sprung to in the light sail the jib stay
painted latter part fresh breezes from N.E. ship
heading N.W. fitted the jib stay so ends

Lat 30° 17' N
Long 169° 00' W

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Sunday the 9th

Fresh breezes from N.E. and cloudy ship
heading N.W. by E saw porpoises middle
and latter part strong N.E. wind ship
heading N so ends Lat 28° 20' N
Long 169° 11' W

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Monday the 10th

Strong N.E. wind tacked ship heading S.E.
middle part wind N.W. ship heading
E by S latter part heading E with all sail
set so ends broke out for meat

Lat 29° 27' N
Long 167° 29' W

February 1845

Tuesday the 11th

Light breezes from N steering E by N at
6 P.M. set the studding sail and main royal
middle part wind hauled to S.W. and
showers of rain latter part fine breezes and
weather steering N by E employed in
fitting rigging so ends Lat 29° 09' N
Long by Chron 165° 13' W
by Lunar 165° 14' W
by Lunar 164° 54' W
