February 1845

Tuesday the 18th

Fresh breezes and good weather at 7 P.M.
all on board hefted her up N.W. & Roseo
bound to Tahiti middle and latter
part fine breezes and good weather
employed in stowing away our recruits
and squeezing lines so ends
all sail set

February 1845

Wednesday the 19th

Fine breeze and good weather heading
by the wind N.E. by N middle and latter
part light E.S.E. winds and good weather
saw an island to the windward
employed in fitting rigging Lat 18° 16'
Long 157° 29'

February 1845

Thursday the 20th

Light breezes ship heading N.E. by N all sail
set all hands employed afternoon fitting
rigging middle and latter part light breeze
and fine weather ship heading N.E. by N
break out for water Lat 17° 03'

February 1845

Friday the 21st

Light wind from N.W. & ship heading N.W.
at 6 P.M. were ship heading E by N wind
N. set five stay and rigging snidle and
latter part fine weather

Lat 16° 58'

Long 156° 28'

February 1845

Saturday the 22nd

Light winds and baffling ship heading
different tacks at 6 P.M. had a rain
squall middle and latter part light
wind from N.E. ship heading N.W.
fitting and taring rigging

Lat 16° 28'

February 1845

Sunday the 23rd

Light breezes from N.E. ship heading
N.W. at 7 P.M. heading N.E. by N
middle and latter part the same so ends
Lat 15° 06'
Long 156° 13'
